Derek N. Cunningham, O.D., F.A.A.O.

Dr. Derek Cunningham is the director of optometry at Dell Laser Consultatants in Austin, Texas. His reasearch invloves retinal drug treatments, glaucoma surgery techniques, ocular surface disease and refractive surgery. Previously, Dr. Cunningham was the resident education supervisor at the Division of Ophthalmology, Texas Tech School of Medicine at El Paso and clinic director for a surgery co-management center in Alabama. He has a special interest in sports vision and he routinely lectures and presents at the National Athletic Trainers Association meeting and American College of Sports Medicine meetings. He is also a council member for the American Optometric Associaiton Sports Vision Section.

Dr. Eric Schmidt is the President of Omni Eye Specialists, a multi-specialty practice headquartered in Wilmington,NC. Dr. Schmidt completed his undergraduate degree from the University of Illinois and his O.D. degree from the Pennsylvania College of Optometry. He completed a residency in Ocular Disease from The Eye Institute in Philadelphia and a fellowship in Glaucoma. Dr. Schmidt is an adjunct professor at various colleges of Optometry and lectures internationally on eye disease.
