JEFFREY ANSHEL, OD

Dr. Jeffrey Anshel is a 1975 graduate from the Illinois College of Optometry. He has written numerous articles and five books regarding nutritional influences on vision and computer vision concerns. Dr. Anshel is the principal of Corporate Vision Consulting, where he addresses the issues surrounding visual demands while working

with computers. He also offers on-site consultations and seminars to corporations related to visual stress and productivity in the workplace. He lectures nationally to eyecare providers on nutrition topics. Dr. Anshel is a Fellow of the American Academy of Optometry and President of the Ocular Nutrition Society. He maintains a private practice in Carlsbad, CA.



GREGORY CALDWELL, OD, FAAO

Greg Caldwell, O.D., is a 1995 graduate of the Pennsylvania College of Optometry. He completed a one year residency in primary care and ocular disease at The Eye Institute in Philadelphia Pennsylvania. He is a fellow of the American Academy of Optometry (AAO) and a Diplomate of the

American Board of Optometry (ABO). He currently works in Duncansville and Johnstown, Pennsylvania as an ocular disease consultant. Dr. Caldwell's primary focus is the diagnosis and management of anterior and posterior segment ocular disease. He was President of the Board of Directors for the Pennsylvania Optometric Association (POA) in 2010 and currently is a member and chair of various POA committees. He is President of the Blair/Clearfield Association for the Blind.

Dr. Paul Chous grew up in Southern California. He was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes mellitus at age five. He received his Doctorate of Optometry in 1991, with highest honors from UC Berkeley. He developed proliferative diabetic retinopathy in 1986 and underwent multiple laser treatments to save his vision. Dr. Chous has practiced optometry with a special

emphasis on diabetic eye disease and diabetes education for 17 years, winning the American Diabetes Association's distinguished Public Service Award in 1998. In 2000, he began work on a book for patients and doctors about the myriad effects of diabetes on the eyes and visual system, Diabetic Eye Disease: Lessons From a Diabetic Eye Doctor (Fairwood Press, 2003), which has been called "one of the most practical and down to earth books on this topic ever written" by noted diabetes specialists. Dr. Chous is a feature writer for the web sites dLife—Your Diabetes Life and Diabetes In Control, an ophthalmic consultant to Children With Diabetes, the Kestrel Diabetes Product Sourcebook and the Diabetes Exercise and Sports Association. He is an adjunct instructor at NOVA Southeastern University College of Optometry in Fort Lauderdale, FL.

EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS

OPTOMETRISTS' EDUCATION PROGRAM

Ocular Manifestations and Treatment of Allergic Disorders

Gregory Caldwell, OD, FAAO COPE #34711-AS Ocular allergies manifest themselves through a variety of changes to the palbebral and bulbar conjunctiva. This course reviews the variety of presentations and discusses the latest pharmaceutical options.

Thyroid Dysfunction and the Eye: Enough Pearls to Make a Bracelet and Pair of Earrings

Gregory Caldwell, OD, FAAO COPE #30429-AS This course unravels and illustrates the close association between the eye and thyroid dysfunction. Clinical features, laboratory testing, clinical examination, and therapeutic options will be reviewed. The ocular manifestations and management of this condition will be discussed.

Oral Pharmaceutical Agents for the Treatment of Ocular Pathologies

Gregory Caldwell, OD, FAAO COPE #31555-PH This course will review the usage of oral antibiotics and oral anti-virals for ocular infections and oral analgesics/narcotics for ocular pain management. Practical information regarding the identification of adverse/allergic reaction, dialysis, pregnancy and maximum daily doses will be discussed. Which are prerequisites before prescribing.

Glaucoma

Gregory Caldwell, OD, FAAO COPE #29180-GL An overview of glaucoma; risk factors, surgical updates, the impacts of pharmaceutical agents and important goals of therapy will be discussed. The course will emphasize clinical pearls for the primary care optometric physician. Case presentations will be the chief format used during this course.

Cyber Security - What You May Not Know Scott Fretheim

Intentionally or not private data is leaked out into the world. How do attackers obtain this data and how can it be used to harm the reputation of your business? How much personal data can attackers access simply by using the Internet? How are attackers using this information to commit healthcare fraud? How does this tie into HIPAA security regulation? What should you and your staff be doing to prevent the loss of sensitive information? This course will answer all of these questions and cover current threats and tactics used by attackers. Understanding current risks will allow you to better protect yourself and your business.

Update on Prevention of Diabetes and Diabetic Retinopathy

A. Paul Chous, MA, OD, FAAO COPE #37497-SD Rates of diabetes and diabetic retinopathy have grown at alarming rates, and eye care practitioners are increasingly faced with educating patients about environmental contributors to these conditions. This course considers some of the most recent and important evidence with respect to prevention of both diabetes and diabetic retinopathy, with an emphasis on dietary strategies, use of scientifically rational nutritional supplements, the importance of physical activity, and efforts to spur favorable redistribution of adipose tissue that modulates both diabetes and obesity.

AMD: A Practical and Proactive Approach

A. Paul Chous, MA, OD, FAAO COPE #37569-PS This course will use cases and other interactive formats to help the attendee create protocols for taking care of patients with AMD. The different factors that help in making clinically sound decisions and practical treatment strategies will be discussed.

Diabetes Disasters

A. Paul Chous, MA, OD, FAAO COPE #37506-SD This course will review some common and not so common disasters pertaining to the care of patients with diabetes and the optometrist's role in preventing these dangerous situations.

Anterior and Posterior Segment Case

Presentations - Enough Pearls to Make a Necklace *Gregory Caldwell, OD, FAAO* COPE #32863-GO This course reviews common to complex anomalies of the anterior and posterior segment in case format. This course will include numerous pathologies pertinent to primary care optometric practice and provide clinicians with pearls, therapeutic options and guidance around pitfalls.

The Power of Nutrition in Ocular and Systemic Health

Jeffrey Anshel, OD COPE #34857-SD It is important that eyecare providers receive timely, evidencebased information in order to address the risks and benefits of supplements to their patients. In this dynamic partnership with patients, providers also need information about dosing and product potency.

The Top 5 Nutritional Supplements for Diabetic Retinopathy

A. Paul Chous, MA, OD, FAAO COPE #35197-PH This course presents the scientific rationale for and evidence supporting the use of specific supplements in the prevention and management of diabetic retinopathy.

Multiple Sclerosis: Some Basics Worth Understanding

A. Paul Chous, MA, OD, FAAO COPE #37475-SD Optometrists are often the first to "diagnose" MS in patients. It is important to be familiar with some of the presenting signs and symptoms as related to eyecare and appropriate steps to take. Time will also be spent on a brief overview of MS treatments.

Jeffrey Anshel, OD COPE #32146-GO Computer use is a visually demanding task and the workplace is more computer-dependent than ever before. The presentation includes such topics as environmental ergonomics, workplace lighting, examination techniques, refractive and binocular vision disorders, history taking, computerized testing, and more.

Diabetes: Are You up to Date?

A. Paul Chous, MA, OD, FAAO COPE #37476-SD

American Pie Meets American Idle: Nutritional And Nutraceutical Management of Obesity Related Eye Disease

A. Paul Chous, MA, OD, FAAO COPE #28697-SD This course presents the biologic rationale for specific nutrients and exercise with respect to insulin resistance, inflammation, oxidative stress, and obesity-related cardiovascular and eye disease. Effective patient communication is considered.

Nutritional Genomics: Genes, Nutrition and Chronic Eye Disease

Jeffrey Anshel, OD COPE #33287-SD This course will provide an integrated overview of the cuttingedge field of nutritional genomics. We will discuss the fundamental principles and scientific methodologies that serve as the foundation for nutritional genomics and explore important recent advances in the treatment of chronic eye disease.

How to Incorporate Nutrition into the Primary Care Practice

Jeffrey Anshel, OD COPE #32288-SD The area of nutritional support for visual disorders is a rapidly growing area of eyecare. This course will show you how it can be a specialization of your practice that offers your patients the best of traditional and complimentary vision care.

Corneal Surgery Update

C. Byron Smith, MD

This course presents the latest updates on treatment of corneal conditions. This will include new treatment and surgical options for patients diagnosed with corneal disease as well as new options in refractive surgery.

COPE #37348-SP

Material, Design and Complications with Soft Contact Lenses

Jeff Machemer, MS, FCLSA AOA-CPC Pending This one hour course will provide the attendees with relevant material history and information relating the fitting complications associated with soft lenses. In addition, the lens design will be discussed as it also influences fit and subsequent complications.

Toric Contact Lens Design and Fitting
