8:00am - 12:00pm Anthony Litwak, OD FAAO Residency and Student Program Director, Baltimore Veterans Administration Medical Center. Attending Doctor, Loch Raven Veterans Administration Outpatient Clinic. Adjunct Clinical Professor, Pennsylvania College of Optometry, State University of New York, Pacific University College of Optometry, and New England College of Optometry. Founding Member of the Optometric Glaucoma Society and National Glaucoma Society, Editorial Board - Optometric Glaucoma Society E-Journal, Program Director, Ocular Therapeutics in Cancun. National and international lecturer on ocular disease. Author of the glaucoma textbook, *The Glaucoma Handbook*. Past Editor-in-Chief, *Clincal Eye and Vision Care*.

8 - 10 Current Concepts of Glaucoma

The course provides the clinician with the latest advances and technologies in glaucoma diagnosis, management and treatment. Topics will include when to initiate glaucoma treatment, how to quantify glaucoma damage, how to set target pressures, and how to judge glaucoma progression. These examples will be used to demonstrate state of the art glaucoma managment.

10 - 12 Neuro Ocular Grand Rounds

This course reviews the clinical features in the differential diagnosis of a patient who presents with swelling of the optic nerve head. Case studies will include AION, optic neuritis, papilledema, pseudotumor cerebri and infiltrative optic neuropathies. Management and treatment protocols will be emphasized.

1:00pm - 3:00 pm Jeffrey Anshel, OD FAAO Dr. Jeffrey Anshel is a 1975 graduate from the Illinois College of Optometry. He has written numerous articles regarding nutritional influences on vision, stress factors that affect visual performance and computer vision concerns. Dr. Anshel has published several books related to vision in the workplace as well as consumer-friendly reference books.

Dr. Anshel is the principal of Corporate Vision Consulting, where he addresses the issues surrounding visual demands while working with computers. He offers on-site consulations and seminars to eyecare professionals and corporations related to visual stress in the workplace. Dr. Anshel is also the current president and founder of the Ocular Nutrition Society. He lectures extensively on nutrition and vision issues. Dr. Anshel is a Fellow of the American Academy of Optometry and he currently maintains a full service practice in Carlsbad, California..

1 - 3 Computer Vision Syndrome: Diagnosis and Treatment

More than 175 million Americans are regular computer users. More patients are coming into eyecare offices with complaints related to computer use. Computer vision syndrome is the most common complaint of computer users and eyecare practitioners are often the first stop for these patients. It is critical that the practitioner be aware of how to test the patient, as well as the causes and resolutions for this condition.

3 - 5 (Dr. Litwak) The Latest and Greatest in Retina

This course reviews the epidemiology, clinical classification, ophthalmoscopic and fluorescein appearance and treatment options for macular degeneration. Classification and treatment protocol based on AREDS will be discussed. New treatment strategies including PDT, macugen lucentis and avastin will be reviewed.

10 - 12 (Dr. Anshel) Smart Medicine for Your Eyes

Scientific evidence has shown that food choices and certain supplements can improve health and lessen symptomes of eye disease. As a result, many Americans are self-prescribing and spending over \$20 billion annually on herbal and dietary supplements. It is important that eyecare providers receive timely, evidence-based information in order to address the risks and benefits of supplements to their patients. In this dynamic partnership with patients, providers also need information about regulatory issues, dosing and product potency.

1 - 2 A Nutritional Approach to Treating Dry Eyes

While most eyecare professionals are aware of the prevalence of dry eye syndrome (DES), many new concepts and products are rapidly becoming available. As the science of DES treatment progresses, it is important for the practitioner to stay abreast of the latest research. This course will review the advances of DES treatment and explore in-depth the true foundation for nutritional treatment of this condition.

2 - 3 The Role of Nutrition In the Primary Care Practice

Incorporating nutritional products into a primary care environment is a challenging task. Using an integrative approach with pharmaceutical and nutritional remedies is recoming a popular concept in the eyecare field. This course will show the practitioner how to read labels, evaluate the latest scientific information behind nutritional products and how to make intelligent decisions on which products meet your standard of care.

8:00am - 4:00pm Lorne Yudcovitch, OD FAAO Dr. Lorne Yudcovitch is an Associate Professor at Pacific University College of Optometry, and served for several years as past Clinic Director of the College's Northeast and Southeast Eye Centers, as well as Staff Optometrist in Corneal Services at the Casey Eye Institute, Oregon Health Sciences University. Dr. Yudcovitch instructs in Ocular Disease, Therapeutics, and Patient Care courses, as well as several clinic areas, and has received the Didactic Faculty of the Year award three years in a row from his students. He has served for several years as Consultant Item Writer for the National Board of Examiners in Optometry. Dr. Yudcovitch has practiced privately in Canada and the United States, lectured nationally and internationally, and has volunteered on several humanitarian eyecare missions and Special Olympics events. He is also co-owner and operator of a private optometric practice in Wilsonville, Oregon.

8 - 9 The Use of Drugs in Addressing Ocular Pain and Discomfort

Pain is a symptom that accompanies many eye diseases. This course aims to discuss the various drugs used in managing pain, their mechanisms of action, and clinical application to specific eye diseases.

9 - 10 Ten Key Oral medications in Eyecare

Several ocular conditions may require the prescribing of oral medications for appropriate management. This casebased course reviews ten oral medications that provide important treatment of various eye conditions.

10 - 11 Uveitis: Treatment Basics

This course serves to familiarize and reinforce the clinical findings and categories of uveitis, and current treatment strategies. Emphasis will be placed on pharmaceutical management and clinical pearls.

1 - 3 3-D Optic Nerve Grand Rounds

Along with recognizing glaucomatous disc changes, the optometrist is often faced with differentiating various optic nerve anomalies and diseases. Stereoscopic viewing of the optic nerve is valuable for both diagnosis and management. This course serves to present several optic nerve cases in a grand rounds format, utilizing three-dimensional technology.

3 - 4 Viral Keratitis: Management Fundamentals

Viral corneal infections are not uncommon in the clinical setting. This course reviews the main viruses of interest, clinical signs, and topical and oral medication management..
