To Reach the Doubletree-Lloyd Center

The hotel is just 15 minutes from the airport. If driving from the airport, exit the parking lot onto Airport Way. Follow Airport Way to I-205 South. Follow I-205 South to I-84 West. Follow I-84 West to Lloyd Boulevard exit (Exit #1). Go to second light, 11th Street, and turn right. The hotel is one block ahead on the left.

The MAX light rail system now picks up passengers at the airport baggage claim and drops you off directly across the street from the front door of the Doubletree Hotel at Lloyd center (Lloyd Center/11th MAX Station stop). The Lloyd Center is only 9 miles from the airport.

With easy access from the Doubletree, Thursday, Friday and Saturday education, as well as the exhibit hall, will be held at the Oregon Convention Center. Sunday education will be held at the Doubletree.

Optometrists play a critical role in the diagnosis, treatment and management of patients in need of cataract and refractive surgery. Each year there are over 2.7 million cataract surgeries performed in the United States. Additionally, increased patient demand and premium elective refractive technologies are spawning a renewed interest in refractive procedures. With the increase in the number of surgeries, there are greater patient expectations and patients demand great outcomes. Premium technologies offer patients an opportunity to increase both their quality of life and quantity of vision. 


