All courses have been submitted for COPE approval.

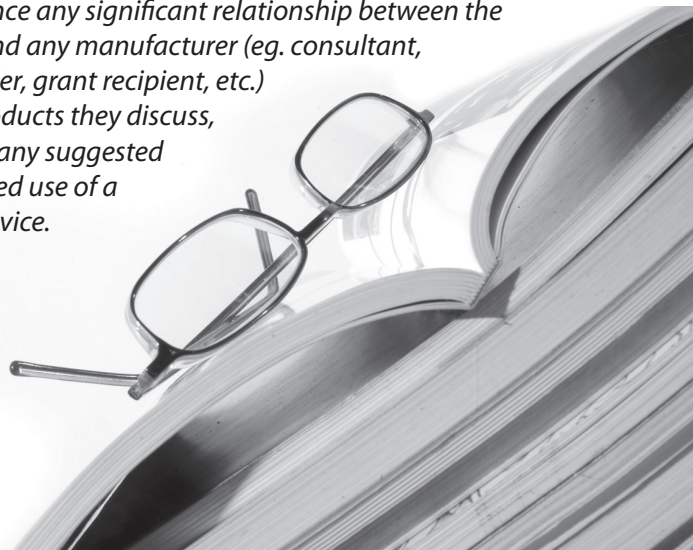
All participants will receive their Attendance Transcript at the conclusion of their final course attended for the weekend.

Cornea and Contact Lens Grand Rounds

The speakers will present patient cases in a grand rounds format in the area of cornea and contact lenses.

The cases will cover topics including current controversies in contact lens complications, managing dry eye and contact lens wear, and specialty contact lens fitting for refractive error and corneal disease.



Attendees will participate in the presentation using TurningPoint technology to help understand the concepts presented as well as reinforce how they currently practice.

8:30 - 10:30 a.m. (*) Lab Testing: Its Role in Diagnosing and Managing Ocular Disease

Tammy Than, MS, OD

The course will provide a clinical review of tests applicable to optometry, how to obtain test samples, and how to interpret the results to be better able to diagnose and manage ocular pathology and systemic diseases that affect the eye. (2 hrs)

Dr. Than received her Doctorate of Optometry from Southern College of Optometry in Memphis, TN. She then completed a residency in Primary Care with an emphasis in ocular disease in Tahlequah, OK. She also has a Master of Science degree in physical chemistry. Currently, Dr. Than is an associate professor at the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Optometry, where she teaches ocular pharmacology and anterior segment disease. She is also Director of the Continuing Education Program. Prior to this she was a staff optometrist at the Carl Vinson VA Medical Center in Dublin, Georgia. She publishes in several optometric journals and lectures nationally on various subjects, including therapeutics, dermatology, and ophthalmic lasers. Dr. Than is a fellow of the American Academy of Optometry. Dr. Than received the UAB President's Teaching Award in 2004, has received numerous teaching awards, and was named Young OD of the South in 2006.

10:30 a.m. Eye Safety: ANSI Z87 and OSHA Perspectives

Gregory Good, OD, PhD

ANSI Z87 committee has made drastic changes in its standards for eye and face protection over the past several years. OSHA has been slow to adopt these changes. This lecture will review the eye safety standard to help ensure that proper eye safety recommendations are made to our patients. (1 hr)

1:00 Myopia Control Through Peripheral Optics

Jeffrey Walline, OD, PhD

This course will discuss methods to manipulate the peripheral optics of the eye in order to slow eye growth. All methods will be clinically relevant and represent methods to discuss with parents for slowing the progression of myopia in children. It will also include information about other methods of myopia control so that optometrists can put other methods into perspective and better discuss options with parents. (1 hr)

2:00 - 4:00 p.m. Contact Lens Update: Challenges and Solutions

Many developments in contact lens materials, designs, and solutions have benefited our patients such that clear vision and comfort is expected for ALL patients. This course will provide an update on recent advances in the contact lens industry that the practitioner can apply to reach that goal! (2 hrs)

Sunday December 2, 2012

8:30 a.m. (*) Whether it's Good Inflammation or Bad Inflammation... It Always Causes Damage

Vondolee Delgado-Nixon, PhD

Our immune system uses inflammation and repair to protect against most pathogens. Sometimes, however, the inflammatory process is activated against our own tissues (autoimmune diseases like SLE and RA) or overly aggressively in response to pathogen or our own tissues (hypersensitivities). In all these conditions, some normal tissue is always destroyed. This course will focus on the mechanisms of inflammation and repair that occur in response to infections and autoimmune diseases, and will discuss the various therapeutic treatments for inflammation. (1 hr)

9:30 - 11:30 a.m. (*) Retinal Inflammatory Disorders

Nicholas Fogt, OD, PhD

This course will cover the diagnosis and management of chorioretinal inflammation, the scarring resulting from chorioretinal inflammation, and the potential causes of retinal inflammation. Both infectious and noninfectious causes of chorioretinal inflammation will be discussed. Emphasis will be placed on those ocular findings and systemic tests that allow for the differential diagnosis of the various causes of inflammation. (2 hrs)

1:00 - 3:00 p.m. (*) Anterior Ischemic Optic Neuropathy and Temporal Arteritis

David Hirsh, MD

This course will review the signs, symptoms and necessary diagnostic testing for diagnosing AION and differentiating between arteritic and non-arteritic forms. Emphasis will be placed on diagnostic testing for temporal arteritis and understanding how to initiate the necessary emergent treatment for this serious condition. (2 hrs)

3:00 p.m. Legal Blindness: It's Not Just 20/200

Roanne Flom, OD

Updates to federal rules regarding statutory blindness and vision disability allow for new ways to test patients, including use of newer acuity tests and automated perimeters. Additionally, there are new ways to interpret data, allowing for combining acuity and field deficits. Case reports and simplified guides to these rules will be provided, allowing doctors to collect, interpret, and report data that may be of substantial value to our patients with impaired vision. (1 hr)
