9 - 11 am 21st Century Glaucoma Therapy
Murray Fingeret, OD, FAAO, Hewlett, NY

This course will describe methods used to treat glaucoma, juxtaposing therapy today with where therapy may be in the foreseeable future. Topics include the concept of risk, and new medical and surgical interventions. COPE 47867-GL, 2 hours IOB/Legend Drug

An important area in the management of glaucoma is the detection of change or progression. This course will explain the assessment of the optic nerve, retinal nerve fiber layer and visual field in watching for change, which instruments come into play, and how they enable the clinician to monitor for progression. 1:30 - 2:30 pm Optical Coherence Tomography in the Diagnosis and Monitoring of Glaucoma

Anti-vascular endothelial growth factor therapy has revolutionized the treatment of neovascular age-related macular degeneration, the leading cause of irreversible legal blindness in the United States. Diagnostic and therapeutic concepts will be reviewed. However, longer-term and real world outcomes have highlighted the limitations of this treatment approach, and this more critical assessment of the literature will be discussed.
