AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE Subject: 3 SECTIONS 17.050.010 DEFINITIONS: 17.05.080 NOTICES OF 4 **VIOLATION ("NOV"); 17.10.050 STANDARDS FOR OPERATING** 5 ANIMAL FACILITIES: 17.15.060 SPECIAL PURPOSE LICENSE; 6 17.15.070 SPECIAL PURPOSE LICENSING PROCEDURES FOR 7 MULTI-ANIMAL AND COMMERCIAL FACILITY LICENSES: 8 17.15.080 REVOCATION OR DENIAL OF APPLICATION FOR 9 LICENSE; AND 17.70.010 ANIMAL CONTROL FEE SCHEDULE. 10 11 12 WHEREAS, Anchorage Animal Care and Control receives numerous public complaints pertaining to nuisance barking dogs; 13 14 WHEREAS, Anchorage Municipal Code Title 17 (Animals) has been determined 15 by the Administration and the Animal Control Advisory Board to need modifications 16 in order to enhance relief for neighbors of barking dogs; 17 18 19 WHEREAS, recommended modifications will: 20 1) Create a separate special purpose license and associated fees for mushing 21 22 facilities; 23 2) Limit twenty minute daytime barking allowances to mushing facilities only. 24 This modification will eliminate twenty minute exceptions for multi-animal 25 and commercial special purpose license holders who do not require 26 additional time for loading, unloading, and the feeding of several mushing 27 28 dogs; 29 3) Clarify that an animal control officer may issue a notice to comply and a 30 notice of violation for the same incident, if deemed appropriate. A notice to 31 32 comply outlines specifics number of days for abatement, actions necessary to correct violation and consequences of non-compliance. A notice of 33 violation imposes a civil fine for a violation; 34 35 4) Replace the "notice to comply" with a "notice to revoke or deny" for owners 36 of special purpose licenses. This modification will emphasize the owner's 37 38 special purpose license is in jeopardy if corrective actions are not taken in

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTIONS 17.050.010 DEFINITIONS; 17.05.080 NOTICES OF VIOLATION ("NOV"); 17.10.050 STANDARDS FOR OPERATING ANIMAL FACILITIES; 17.15.060 SPECIAL PURPOSE LICENSE; 17.15.070 SPECIAL PURPOSE LICENSING PROCEDURES FOR MULTI-ANIMAL AND COMMERCIAL FACILITY LICENSES; 17.15.080 REVOCATION OR DENIAL OF APPLICATION FOR LICENSE; AND 17.70.010 ANIMAL CONTROL FEE SCHEDULE.

WHEREAS, recent animal control cases and decisions from the Anchorage Administrative Hearing Office raised questions about the ability for enforcement to adequately address matters; especially noise, related to animal facilities under Anchorage Municipal Code Title 17;

WHEREAS, the Animal Care & Control Center, responsible for enforcement of Title 17, needs a consistent standard to enable efficient enforcement and administration of its cases;

WHEREAS, the purpose of Title 17 is to "promote public health and safety and to encourage responsible pet ownership and the humane care of animals";

WHEREAS, Animal Care & Control currently has 333 active multi-animal facility licenses issued within the Municipality of Anchorage, 37 of which are held by mushers:

WHEREAS, exemption from the chronic animal noise five consecutive minute rule was created for mushers to have up to four times per day to feed, load up and transport their dogs, provided no 20-minute period shall occur within one hour of any other 20-minute period;

WHEREAS, the vast majority of chronic noise complaints are not associated with mushers licensed under the multi-animal facility category;

WHEREAS, the Animal Control Advisory Board supports this amendment as detailed in their attached resolution 2017-01, now, therefore,

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code section 17.05.010 is hereby amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

17.05.010 Definitions, generally.

The following words, terms and phrases and their other verb forms and tenses, when used in this title, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

* * * +++

Chronic animal noise means repeated vocalization by an animal or animals from the time the noise begins for more than five consecutive minutes during the daytime noise period from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. and more than five consecutive minutes during the nighttime noise period from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. A licensed mushing facility, [COMMERCIAL OR MULTI ANIMAL FACILITY] as defined below, [LICENSED FOR FOUR OR MORE DOGS] shall be excused from the five consecutive minutes limit for daytime noise only, up to four times per day, for a maximum of 20 consecutive minutes each time provided that no excused [20-MINUTE] period shall occur within one hour of any other excused [20-MINUTE] period. An excused period means more than 5 consecutive minutes and less than 20 consecutive minutes.

Mushing Facility means a person or facility, including a dwelling unit, residence, or business premise that owns, houses, possesses, or acts as custodian of four or more dogs over the age of four months, that have been trained to be harnessed and pull sleds, carts, vehicles with humans and/or cargo for the sport of mushing whether for recreation, competition or remuneration.

Section 2. Anchorage Municipal Code section 17.05.080 is hereby amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

17.05.080 **Notices of violation ("NOV").**

* * *

A. Upon verifying a violation of this title has occurred, an officer may issue a notice to comply and/or a notice of violation ("NOV") and serve it on the owner or custodian of the animal if that person can be identified at the time of the violation. If the owner cannot then be identified, the officer may impound the animal and serve the notice to comply or NOV at such time as the owner of the animal can be identified.

 <u>Section 3.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code section 17.10.050 is hereby amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

17.10.050 Standards for operating animal facilities.

A. An owner or operator of a commercial facility, multi-animal facility, mushing facility, or any other facility associated with keeping of domestic animals for which a <u>license</u> [PERMIT] is required, as specified under chapter 17.15 and any other municipal regulations, shall:

<u>Section 4.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code section 17.15.060 is hereby amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

17.15.060 Special purpose license.

A. The following special purpose licenses shall be required for persons or facilities keeping animals in the municipality:

*** *** ***

- 4. Mushing Facility License.: A person or facility, including a dwelling unit, residence, or business premise that owns, houses, possesses, or acts as custodian of four or more dogs over the age of four months, that have been trained to be harnessed and pull sleds, carts, vehicles with humans and /or cargo for the sport of mushing whether for recreation, competition or for remuneration shall be required to obtain a mushing facility license.
 - This license shall be valid for two years from date of issuance.
 - b. This license shall be valid for any dogs, cats, rabbits, ferrets, or horses owned by the same person or facility of the mushing dogs on the same premises.
 - c. This section does not apply to rescue groups approved by and registered with the animal care and control center.
- B. Each animal in the facility, in addition to those covered under section 17.15.010C.3, that is required to have a MOA dog license shall be provided that license at no additional cost to the holder of the multiple animal facility license or <u>mushing facility license</u>.

Editor's note— In connection with the adoption of AO 2001-158 (S-4) As Amended, approved on June 25, 2002 and effective January 1, 2003, Assembly expression of legislative intent on June 11, 2002, was that any reference to "business" or "commercial" in Title 17 does not mean conducting a business for the purposes of other Titles.

<u>Section 5.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code section 17.15.070 is hereby amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

17.15.070 Special purpose licensing procedures for multi-animal, mushing, and commercial facility licenses.

*** *** ***

D. Upon receipt of a complete and timely application for renewal of a special purpose license, such license shall be issued within 30 days unless the applicant has received notice the special purpose license has been revoked or there has been a structural change to the property. No new or previously revoked multi-animal, mushing, or commercial facility license shall be issued until an inspection of the premises where the animals will be kept is made.

<u>Section 6.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code section 17.15.080 is hereby amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

17.15.080 Revocation or denial of application for license.

*** *** ***

B. An animal control officer shall issue a notice to revoke or deny a special purpose license [COMPLY, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 17.05.080,] for any violation of this title or failure to adhere to conditions for the issuance of a special purpose license. The notice shall state in writing the steps the applicant may take, with a set reasonable time period, to correct any violations stipulated. If the officer observes conditions that immediately threaten an animal's or the public's health, safety or welfare, an order to cease and desist operation may be issued in lieu of a notice to revoke or deny [COMPLY]. Following the time period stipulated in the notice to revoke or deny [COMPLY], an inspection shall be made by the animal care and control center to determine if the violation is abated or corrected. 17.70.010 Animal control fee schedule.

A. The chief animal control officer shall provide for collection and disbursement of the following fees and refunds in the administration of Title 17:

MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ANIMAL CONTROL ADVISORY BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 2017-01

WHEREAS, the Animal Control Advisory Board is charged with advising the Mayor and Assembly on animal matters within the Municipality of Anchorage; and

WHEREAS, recent animal control cases and decisions from the Anchorage Administrative Hearing Office raised questions about the ability for enforcement to adequately address chronic animal noise issues related to special purpose license holders under Anchorage Municipal Code Title 17;

WHEREAS, the Animal Care & Control Center, responsible for enforcement of Title 17, needs a consistent standard to enable efficient enforcement and administration of its cases:

WHEREAS, the purpose of Title 17 is to "promote public health and safety and to encourage responsible pet ownership and the humane care of animals";

WHEREAS, Mushers currently hold approximately 9% of all active multi-animal facility licenses issued within the Municipality of Anchorage;

WHEREAS, exemption from the chronic animal noise five consecutive minute rule was created with mushers in mind to have up to four times per day to feed, load up and transport their dogs. It was not intended to provide home owners or commercial facilities with a mechanism to inflict unwarranted chronic animal noise upon their neighbors;

WHEREAS, mushers licensed under the multi-animal facility category are seldom cited for chronic noise beyond the twenty minute exemption;

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPAL ANIMAL CONTROL ADVISORY BOARD HEREBY RESOLVES:

THAT, Anchorage Municipal Code be amended to add a separate mushing facility license and limit the chronic animal noise daytime 20 minute periods to mushing facilities only in Title 17 (Animals).
