Black Rock Group Federal Advocacy/Messaging Project

STATEMENT OF WORK

Black Rock Group (BRG) agrees to exert its best efforts to perform all services requested by Alaska Gasline Development Corporation (AGDC) under this Statement of Work (SOW), which is made effective as of November 1, 2017.

BACKGROUND

The Black Rock Group will provide the Alaska Gasline Development Corporation with strategic counsel on how to effectively communicate the benefits associated with the Alaska LNG Project to Trump Administration officials, Capitol Hill, federal regulators and policymakers.

BRG will work to amplify the benefits of the Alaska LNG Project. An endeavor that not only has the potential to become America's largest public works project, but also a significant factor in correcting our nation's current balance of trade.

BRG will work with AGDC to craft a specialized approach to this effort that monitors progress and ensures a return on investment.

OBJECTIVES

The goal of this campaign will be to effectively communicate to the nation the benefits of the Alaska LNG Project that balances economic growth, job creation, energy exports and environmental sustainability to current and future generations. To accomplish this goal, we must set out clear objectives that will provide a suitable foundation for an aggressive, disciplined and actionable public affairs campaign. These objectives include:

- 1. Supporting AGDC's efforts around the federal permitting and land swap processes.
- 2. Launching a comprehensive public affairs campaign capable of successfully influencing national opinion and driving dialogue to assist with the commercial sale of LNG.
- 3. Communicating the progress and viability of the project to aid in additional financing.

SCOPE OF WORK

This SOW covers the following activities and deliverables:

- Value of AK LNG to Alaska and the U.S.
 - Condense economic information to message national and state benefit of AK LNG
 - o U.S. balance of Pacific Rim trade
 - o Value of export from AK LNG in balancing Pacific Rim trade
 - o Japan, China, Korea and other Asian countries
 - o Energy for U.S. allies and partners in the Pacific Rim
 - o U.S. jobs during construction and long-term operation of AK LNG infrastructure

- o Lower cost of energy in AK for Federal facilities
- o National security implications
- o Resource development
- o Urban residents benefit via direct access to natural gas
- o Rural residents benefit via revenue sharing provisions of SB 138

Messaging strategy on job creation and infrastructure components

- o Identify key policy personnel to discuss these items in case the need arises
- o Determine best messaging language to elicit support
- o Identify appropriate process for official announcements
