1. INTRODUCTION

The Board of Administration serves the Canadian General Conference in a number of roles. The Board serves as the Board of Directors for the corporation of The Free Methodist Church in Canada, providing general direction on overall corporate and financial matters. It also serves as a "policy board" giving overall guidance and direction to the Bishop and senior level staff. Finally, the board also serves as the proxy for the General Conference between Conference sessions, in particular providing final approval of MEGAP Committee actions related to the admission of Ministers and Ministerial Candidates, ordination of Ministers, appointments to local churches, and other related changes in ministerial status.

To some extent the emphasis of the Board's work has changed since the last General Conference. For a number of years, leading up to the last General Conference, a significant amount of the Board's time and attention were directed towards the issues related to implementing the new Canadian organization structure and developing the new *Manual of the Free Methodist Church in Canada*. With the approval of the new *Manual* at the last General Conference, your Board has been able to redirect its attention from planning and documenting the new organization structure to actually operating under the new *Manual*.

2. ORGANIZATION

The Manual gives each Board the flexibility to organize itself in the committee structure that will allow the best administration of the ministry programs of the Canadian church. Shortly after their election, the new Board members met to organize the Board into the following sub-committees:

- Church Development: to provide guidance for the national ministry programs for new church planting and church growth and development
- Leadership: to provide guidance for national programs for the development of pastoral and lay leadership, and co-ordination of the scholarship programs of the Canadian church. This subcommittee also provided the interface between the Board and the MEGAP committee.
- Management: to manage the financial resources, and act as the corporate Trustees, and managers of the corporate Pension Plan
- Overseas Missions: to provide guidance for the ministry programs of the church related to our involvement in and support of Overseas Missions, and the Visa and Full-time missionaries commissioned by the Canadian church.

All major actions of these sub-committees, as well as actions that did not fall within their scope were reviewed and approved by the Board as a whole.

In addition, the Board also appointed two advisory committees:

Audit Committee: to interface with the corporate auditor and to recommend action needed to
ensure the financial integrity of the corporation.

Personnel Committee: to advise the Board on personnel policy matters, and assist in
developing and implementing a process for evaluating the performance of all corporation staff,
including the Bishop.

To ensure that the Board received unbiased advice, both of these committees included members from outside the Board.

3. MAJOR BOARD OBJECTIVES/ACTION

At its first meeting following the General Conference of 1999, the Board undertook a review of the objectives and direction established in the resolutions approved by the General Conference and assigned these to its subcommittees to ensure that these goals were actioned. In addition, each of the subcommittees identified a number of goals it wished to achieve during the following three-year period. Progress towards these goals was monitored regularly.

MAJOR GOALS AND ACTIONS

A. CHURCH DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

Church Development undertook a review to identify churches that were ready to move to a Parenting Church Network (PCN) and established three PCNs.

Church Development and the Board approved funding support for a significant number of new church plantings, new congregations/alternate services across Canada.

During this past term the Board has approved the transfer of the Almonte, Ontario Fellowship to full Society Status, and the transfer of the Next Church from a church planting status to Fellowship Status.

B. LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE

The Leadership Committee has taken active steps to improve the processes for delivery of the courses required for ordination.

An updated internship program has been implemented. The improvements were made to ensure that the internship assignments better prepare the candidates for active ministry.

The Leadership Committee and MEGAP have jointly approved an updated process for the identification of new ministerial candidates, and revised requirements for appointment of Commissioned Ministers (replacing Deacons) and Ordained Ministers (replacing Elders). Related updates to Section 8 of *The Manual* have also been developed.

C. MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Management Committee took steps to reduce the 10% overhead withdrawn from Giving Streams receipts to 4%. The Committee hopes to be able to completely eliminate this overhead in the future.

The Management Committee and Board have approved the final incorporation of Wesley Acres Retreat Centre and Campground (now known as Wesley Acres Inc.). As part of this process, Wesley Acres has signed an Association Agreement with The Free Methodist Church in Canada, and a Trade-Mark License Agreement, which together provide a wide-range of protections of the interests of the FMCIC. Other campground associations are actively considering incorporation. Our objective is to have all campground associations incorporated.

The Management Committee has completed drafting of legal "precedent" documents designed to provide local churches with legal text to be used in incorporating local churches. These documents are now in the hands of our legal counsel for final drafting and editing.

A new policy statement on the "Fiscal Phase-In" of new churches in the Core funding program is under development. This document will define the expectations of the FMCIC regarding the participation of new church plants, fellowships and associate churches and full societies in the Core Funding program. This policy is designed to ensure equitable participation in Core Funding by all churches within the FMCIC

The Board has approved establishment of a number of Endowment Funds to be managed by the *Free Methodist Foundation in Canada*, including an Overseas Missions Project Fund, an Aldersgate Endowment Fund, a Wesley Studies Endowment Fund, a Church Development Fund and an Operational Endowment Fund. Related capital held by the FMCIC has been transferred to the *Foundation* for management. The return on investments from these funds is transferred to the FMCIC for ongoing operation of the related ministry programs. This effectively places the principal amounts of these funds at arms length, eliminating the risk that these funds could be attached as a result of a law suit against the FMCIC.

D. OVERSEAS MISSIONS

Overseas Missions has taken steps in conjunction with the Ministerial Education, Guidance and Placement Committees to ensure that ministerial candidates have the opportunity to express their views on global ministrics during interviews. This will not only help to identify future candidates for full time or VISA mission assignments, but will also help us better understand the vision of potential ministerial candidates for global ministries.

Our relationship with the North American Missions Committee (NAMC) has continued to develop. The Board has recommended that future representatives from the Canadian church to this committee should be members of the Overseas Missions Committee of the Board of Administration, to further improve liaison between the Board and the NAMC.

E. GENERAL CONFERENCE

The Board members also collectively participated in a tele-survey, individually contacting pastors and board chairs or lay delegates from a large number of churches. This survey was designed to evaluate the views of pastors and local churches on a number of topics related to the programs and role of the national church, and issues that needed to be considered at this General Conference. The information gathered in this survey assisted the Board in defining the Study Teams for this General Conference.

F. THE HERALD

The Director of Ministry Advancement undertook a communications survey to evaluate the effectiveness of and interest in a number of the communications tools and publications of The Free Methodist Church in Canada. Based on the results, the Board approved a recommendation to continue subsidies for and publication of *The Herald*.

G. THE MANUAL

The Board reviewed edits to *The Manual* based on decisions made during General Conference and approved publication of the first approved addition of *The Manual*.

4. STAFF APPRECIATION

It would be remiss of us to conclude this report without recognizing and congratulating our staff on their efforts on behalf of the FMCIC during the past few years:

- We wish to congratulate Bishop Elford and Mary-Elsie (Fletcher) Wolfe for their election in mid-1999 as the President and Secretary of the first World Conference of the Free Methodist Church.
- This report indicated earlier that the Board of Administration serves primarily as a policy board. The Board has met face-to-face for six meetings over the three-year period between General Conference sessions. Much of the work of preparing input to assist the Board in its decision making and guidance roles, and all of the effort involved in implementing the resulting policies and decisions falls on the shoulders of our staff. Nothing would be accomplished if it were not for their diligent and excellent efforts and long-hours of work.

The previous Vision Statement was: "It is the vision of The Free Methodist Church in Canada to see healthy churches within the reach of every Canadian."

- 3. The "in Canada" keeps a focus on our nation.
- 4. The "and beyond" makes this a both/and kind of statement and integrates evangelism in Canada with mission activity beyond our borders.

STANDING RULES RELATED TO THE SUSPENSION AND TRIAL OF REV. WALTER TWIDDY

1. Regarding Discussions Related to the Suspension and Trial

Whereas:

Reverend Walter Twiddy was charged by the Western MEGaP Committee with Insubordination, and suspended effective December 31, 2001,

And Whereas:

Mr. Walter Twiddy's suspension by MEGaP on the grounds of Insubordination was upheld at trial on May 9, 2002, and Mr. Twiddy was expelled by order of the Trial Committee.

And whereas:

Mr. Twiddy has the right to appeal, and has 30 days to give notice of intent to appeal (¶925.6 of *The Manual*),

And whereas:

At Mr. Twiddy's request, he was represented at trial by Legal Counsel, thus requiring the MEGaP Committee to also be represented by Legal Counsel, and necessitating in our view, that both parties be represented by Legal Counsel during any appeal,

And whereas:

A full statement of the grounds for the appeal, which must be presented at least 5 days before the trial of the appeal, has not yet been received.

And whereas:

A copy of the official transcript of the trial may be essential to the proper adjudication of the grounds for the appeal and the official transcript is not yet available.

And whereas:

By the underlying nature of the charges, Bishop Elford is a party to the dispute and therefore cannot act as the presiding officer for the appeal,

And whereas:

Under ¶925.6 the appeal may be referred to a committee, which will consist of members and delegates to this conference and discussion of evidence or issues related to the charges or trial may therefore prejudice a fair and unbiased hearing of the appeal,

Therefore, be it resolved that:

That the General Conference adopt a standing rule, that any matters relating to the details of the dispute, the charges, the Church Trial, and the grounds for the appeal shall not be permitted on the floor of the General Conference at any time or in any form.

2. Regarding a Process For Presenting A Notice Of Appeal

Whereas:

Under ¶925.6 Mr. Walter Twiddy has until June 8, 2002 to give notice of his intent to appeal,

And whereas:

¶925.6 does not define the procedures for presenting notice,

Therefore be it resolved that:

That the General Conference direct that, should Mr. Twiddy wish to present notice of intent to appeal during the General Conference, that such notice be presented in writing to the Secretary. The Secretary will then inform the Conference of the receipt of such notice at the earliest opportunity.

THE FREE METHODIST CHURCH IN CANADA 2002 REPORT OF THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE TO THE GENERAL CONFERENCE

BACKGROUND TO THE REPORT

The General Conference Nominating Committee has worked diligently in the interim between General Conferences to provide nominations in response to requests made by the Board of Administration when resignations from various conference committees have occurred. Additionally, the Nominating Committee prepared nominations for the Study Teams for the Board of Administration's approval. We wish to thank all who assisted us with suggesting names for these positions.

In the 1999 General Conference major work was done to establish terms of office so that in any given year, approximately one third of each committee would need to be replaced. Of course, from time to time, resignations have become necessary and so nominees need to be identified for those areas. In the report that follows (and on the ballot which will be provided at the General Conference), the names in bold indicate those who are being nominated to new terms (or to complete the terms of others who have resigned) on the Board of Administration, Study Commission on Doctrine, and Ministerial Education, Guidance and Placement Committee.

The Nominating Committee has used the following process in the preparation of its nominations:

- Everyone serving on the Board of Administration or a standing committee were approached to indicate
 whether or not they wished to continue to serve on the BOA/Committee on which they presently serve.
- Once it was known which members would continue to serve, nominees were identified to fill in the blanks.
- The standing bodies needing nominations are:
 - Board of Administration
 - Ministerial Education, Guidance and Placement Committee (MEGaP) 5 regions
 - Study Commission on Doctrine
 - Nominating Committee: The existing Nominating Committee members have been assigned one-, two-, or three-term tenures. As one can see in the report, it will not be necessary to elect new members from every area of the conference.
