An Evening of Soaring Music at St. Vartan Cathedral



The program turned to the work of another Armenian musical icon—the great Charles Aznavour—with a riveting performance by the National Chamber Orchestra of Armenia: a 22-piece string orchestra under the baton of conductor and artistic director Sipan Hakobyan Olah.

Gorgeous melodies from Aznavour's repertoire were made even more emotionally resonant by the ensemble's

The arched vaults of New York's St. Vartan Cathedral rang with soaring music on the evening of Saturday, October 4, thanks to a unique concert event titled "Jazzical Komitas and Classical Aznavour."

The concert went forward under the auspices of Diocesan Primate Bishop Mesrop Parsamvan. On behalf of the Primate, Cathedral Vicar Fr. Davit Karamyan welcomed the sold-out audience to an of evening visionary artistry—one which honored Armenian musical heritage while looking optimistically to the future.

Virtuoso jazz pianist Joel Martin set the evening's tone by offering a modern take on the immortal works



of Komitas Vartabed. Leading a jazz trio including David Dunaway on string bass and Jon Berger on drums, Martin revealed how Komitas' music can lend itself to fresh interpretations that transmit its emotional richness in remarkable new ways.

lush orchestral arrangements. Hayarpi Yeghikyan and Maestro Olah devoted their beautiful soprano and tenor voices to Aznavour's poetic lyrics, in a moving tribute to the late French-Armenian musician.

Among the guests at the concert was Ambassador Parouyr Hovannisyan, Armenia's newly appointed Permanent Representative to the United Nations, and the directors of the National Chamber Orchestra, Felix Baburyan and Garegin Sargsyan.

The concert concluded with tremendous applause from the audience, and gratitude expressed to the musicians and organizers. Afterwards, guests and artists alike enjoyed the warm autumn air during a lovely reception on the outdoor plaza, with the edifice of St. Vartan Cathedral dramatically illuminated by colored lights.

The delegation immersed itself in the life of the local Armenians, visiting key President Sam Simonian, Cour 1 of Trustees member Elie Akilian and Natalie G or lian, Director of Chapters and Central Board Admin stration, met with the YP Melbourne and AGBU chapter Youth

Sydney Highlights

The second stop in Sydney also began with a warm reception by the local community. First on the agenda was a tour of AGBU Alexander Primary School (PreK-6), where the delegation attended the soft opening and blessing of the school's new library and multi-purpose The group center also visited Hamazkaine Arshak and Sophie Galstaun College, showing their support for the city's Armenian educational institutions. The following day, the AGBU Sydney Chapter, which was established in 1965, hosted a welcome gathering of 100 guests including AGBU leadership, benefactors, and clergy.

Meaningful meetings were scheduled with key community stakeholders, including esteemed Vahe Artinian, Chair of the Tekeyan Cultural Association and a longtime former Chair of AGBU Sydney, as well as with the Young Professionals of Sydney and current AGBU Sydney Chapter board members.

During the concert, Vahe Boyadiian, member of the school board, was honored with an AGBU Certificate of Appreciation presented to him by President Sam Simonian.

School Principal Manoug Demirjian stated: "Today, AGBU Alexander Primary School stands as a living testament to the vision of the founding members. It is a place where children are surrounded by the tradition and the excitement of

modern education. Let us dream bigger. Let us build stronger. Let us ensure that the future is filled with even greater achievements."



Pope Leo to make first papal trip to Türkiye and Lebanon next month



Pope Leo XIV will travel to Türkiye and Lebanon in a six-day trip beginning late November, his first voyage since becoming head of the Catholic Church, the Vatican said on Oct. 7.

The 70-year-old American is expected in Türkiye from Nov. 27-30, a visit

that "will include a pilgrimage to İznik on the occasion of the 1,700th anniversary of the First Council of Nicaea," Vatican spokesman Matteo Bruni said in a brief statement.

A subsequent trip to Lebanon will take place from Nov. 30 to Dec. 2, he said, adding that an itinerary would come later.

The last pope to visit Lebanon was Benedict XVI in 2012, while the last papal visit to Türkiye was in 2014, when Pope Francis travelled to the capital Ankara and Istanbul and met with President Recep Tayyip Erdogan.

Nicaea, which is now the city of İznik and is located 100 kilometers (62 miles) southeast of Istanbul, hosted the first ecumenical council in Christian history in 325 AD.

Leo's highly anticipated visit to Lebanon is expected to focus on peace in the multi-faith country, which has committed to disarming non-state groups, particularly the Iran-backed Shiite movement Hezbollah.

During a trip to the Vatican in June, Lebanese President Joseph Aoun, a Maronite Christian, invited the pope to visit his country.






