and went to Harwood in evening  
Had supper at Steel's

25<sup>th</sup> Met Mr. Rutter who is supplying  
at Ocean & Ocean Bygone & talked  
over the work & conditions at  
the latter place.  
Went to Ocean Bygone & visited a  
number of families there and  
returned to Philadelphia & spent  
the night.

26<sup>th</sup> My wife was suffering & day,  
Went to Ocean Bygone & after working  
until late returned to Philadelphia  
found my wife some better.

27 Spent the <sup>part of</sup> afternoon at  
C. Lyman's returned to Wood  
to join my family and to see  
at Abington. We spent the night  
with Mr. London Chamber & family.

28. We came to Pliska & Mrs. D. and  
Marian left for Wood on  
11:30 A.M. train, A. B.

Went to Cranby and did  
work on fields. Spent the night  
with Mr. Chamber & family  
at Wood.

Did work in morning at Dr.  
Pablicis and in P.M. was  
present at the first full  
meeting of the U. of P. at  
Wood.

Went to Wood by night and did  
some calling & attended the  
Bible group by the Aqueduct  
at Wood in the P.M. & evening.

29 Attended the 104th anniversary  
services of the church pastorate  
at Wood. Pliska & I were at  
Wood - a very great  
day 1000 to 1200 people present  
could hardly realize that it

was possible to have such a  
congregation at this place  
the small village of 1140  
people.

Went to Cranby and spoke at the  
school at 2 P.M.

Reached at Wood at 8 P.M.  
Had a very interesting service  
It was a great satisfaction to meet  
all my friends & to be con-  
sidered by them.

30 This P.M. went to Battenon to meet  
the Board of the Mission. Had  
over with Dr. B. Battenon at 5 P.M.  
& spent the night with his family.

October 1912.

1. Had come by with Rev. Battenon &  
family & spent nearly the morn-  
ing at their home. At 12:30 had  
lunch dinner at Dr. Battenon's  
with the Board, at 2 P.M. met

attention to any presenta-  
tion of the work done, its  
present condition, its claims  
upon us as a church, or  
duty to our own appearing as  
a church there etc. I did  
not ask them for any defini-  
tive action relative to the  
repealing of the work now.  
But assured them that such is  
expected. I also told them that  
they had not done the gain  
they in this closing the work  
without first giving out the  
representation of the church, a  
warning. I also asked Dr. Chute,  
who is one of the chief oppo-

was taken up. But to this he  
gave no satisfactory reply.

Mr. Bunchley and I left  
with the hope of attending a  
meeting at Harwood but  
we were too late!  
Went to Dr. Pufferman's & spent  
the night. Had

4 Did some clerical work.  
Went to Centre & then in P.M.  
to Centre by R.R. B.  
Called on Rev. of the Dept.  
Church but did not find time  
was called on others & spent  
the evening with Jan Reed  
& had dinner there. called  
on Pufferman & came up to  
Harwood to spend the night  
with Mr. Tom Chambers.  
Had a pleasant evening 7:30  
to 11 P.M.

5 Had a good night's rest  
Made a number of calls  
in Harwood - Had dinner

with Mrs. Schuyler & family  
for woman who is very  
afflicted.

Went to Mr. Clibbe taking  
my bag to Jim McChambers  
& Dr. Pufferman's.

With Dr. Pufferman went to the  
Football game between the  
U.S.P. & the Schuyler team.  
Left in the day went to  
Green Springs and did some  
pastoral work. Attended the  
Bible for a time and  
then went to Mr. Clibbe. In the  
evening Dr. Pufferman & I was  
late and I was tired.

Exp. visited Rev. Dr. Ark of his  
personal services at Green  
Springs well attended, had other  
men with him & family.  
Went to Clibbe & addressed  
the school. Did some  
canvassing - had dinner at  
the home of Mrs. Weinst.  
Preached at 8 P.M. at Green

7-11 attended the Minis-  
ters meeting on Sunday  
(7) Went to the Plant (Dr P's) and  
got my bag & conferred with  
Dr. Gaterman coming from an  
Went to Reading on 4:30  
& found my place & lodging  
attended (Communion service)  
and met many of the brethren  
every day & had every spent of  
Synod awaiting action  
on the A. Am. work.

Thursday was a warm  
& forgotten day, (1) The  
Synod received the Joint  
Lutheran Church of Passaic  
Syndicate into full  
Synodical relationship.  
(2) They authorized Dr  
Lieberman, S. W. S. & E.  
Hallberg, at Sweden, &  
Ruscio, Argentina, (3) By  
an almost unanimous  
vote - only one dissenting -  
the Synod passed a  
Resolution asking the  
Board of Home Missions  
to reopen the South

American work, and  
(4) and in case they will  
not do so a resolution  
was passed in-  
structing the delegates  
to the General Synod  
to memorialize that  
body to reopen said  
work, (5) The Synod  
elected the writer as a  
delegate to the General  
Synod by 53 votes,  
Blessed be the name of  
the Lord. This is an  
evidence of the Lord's  
fulfilling his promise  
in Ps. 37<sup>45</sup>, in which  
I had found special  
helpful comfort in our  
hour of darkness.  
Remained to the night  
session largely to ex-  
press my heartfelt  
thanks to the Lord for  
his wonderful work.
