1913 Diary 1913

Jan 1, this is begining of my Synodical work,
Spent the moments of the
closing year in humble grateful
prayer - Temple Church Rausgall
in thanksgiving to my Father for his
many mercies & lovingkindnesses
and in supplications for grace to
live & serve in harmony with
his will & purposes, retired at
10:30 P.M. & rose at 8 o'clock, did
some Bible reading in Spanish
as part of my devotions, did
some work & at 10:50 sent
a wire message of New Year
greetings to my loved ones at
Williamsport, Pa. would be
glad to be with them,
Mr. Lunde went to Judson
Madison Heights N.J. & had a very
helpful conference with Rev.
& Mrs. Bartholomew, we had
prayer together, met the
Lundes & had a carriage

side with them, before re-
turning made a call
on the Grossmans
Hastent to meet my boy at St. Phila
but not coming on that train
I missed him & my great
disappointment, - He came &
my lodging place & we had
a most pleasant evening &
sympathy, concluding it with
prayer & Bible reading!

2. We had our worship together
& called on Dr. Fahlman
and his family whom we had
a half hour of warm fellow-
ship! We examined the stati-
sticians & practically settled on
one, saw Mr. Mattson, called
to see Lawyer Gust concerning

Publishing Co. Was not in.
He had an enjoyable lunch
together at the G. M. C. C. and
he left at 3:20 p.m. for St. Louis-
burg, I went to Caledonia
& was much encouraged
in my work in canvassing
for a birth. church there.

It was late when I got to my
room.

3. The night was rather (troublesome
in matter of rest. Thanks for
thy blessing dear books. I have
now contracted a cold in
my room which was without
my ~~leaving~~ ^{leaving} just today morning. Went
to my office & worked up to
3:20 p.m. The weather being too
inclement for me to ex-
pose myself in ringing door bells
in Caledonia I came home
at 5. To my room - set home - and
went to bed up to 6 o'clock &
felt some better. Worked up to
10 p.m. & retired.

4. Thanks to the Lord, my cold
is much better this morning
We forgive our iniquities & heal
all our diseases etc" Ps 103:3-4,
Worked on my report for December
went to center & gave the Christmas

uplift (downlift) people and
was admired by his porters

Went to Audubon & conversed
with me throughout up to 6 PM,
had dinner with Rev. Mrs. Bon-
thompson & Heald on Wright
& then responded to an invita-

program. It was 11:15 when
I reached my room.

5- Had a very wakeful night -
perhaps due to my having
drunk very strong coffee I got
the supper, but whatever the
cause it gave me time for
some serious reflection.
Did deep & continuous breathing
which is always restful
and refreshing.
Rosal about 8:15 & 9:30 my
devotions hastened to the
center & again, as I thought
the 8:40 train to Fort Washington
stopped to get under way & exp

7 coffee & to my surprise
I learned that the train left
Amherst at 8:30 - or missed
it to my great disappoint-
ment.

Had to wait until the 10 train
franked at 10:45. Got Hub. 2³
Dons How escape.

Had dinner with Rev. Mrs. Bon-
thompson? At 2:40 went to Plymouth
& had a conference with her,
Kusch relation to the speaking
of a pastor. Found that they are
well on in this & may probably
extend a call to Rev. Portson
of St. Paul, Concord

Returned to N. H. & was met
by my host who went with
me to do some pastoral work
we met some interesting
people that should be
pastored in to that church
franked at 7:30 for the 11:15

God" made an appeal to the
people to do their part as

6. Had a few nights rest even though my cold does not seem to be cured but I worked on my monthly report in transcribing & compiling it. Was late in getting to the Ministers meeting.

Had our Advisory Mission Com. meeting at 120, then even present D. ^{Fahling} ~~Bathman~~, ~~Der~~, ~~Strubbe~~, Messrs Chizevine, Kile & Slank, Made my report & resigned from the superintendency of the Conference work, as I had accepted the superintendency of the Synodical work & had begun work on Jan 1st 1813.

The work closed with a small balance in the Treasury over & above all expenses. This was most gratifying in the face of the fact that the Com. decided to debit the amount pledged by the Synod \$125 in that we began our work 12 yrs ago under financial embarrassments but in faith in our bond of the harvest

that we would provide the means needed if we would but go forward in the work and we did it. Blessed be the holy name, now & forever Amen. Reported 51 names already secured for membership in the proposed Hudsonian Lutheran Church.

Went with Mr Harvey Miller & Dr Hartman to Jersey R.R. offices & put my order for the year. Did some clerical work & for getting some lunch went to my room & devoted my call & made an effort to do some clerical work for tomorrow Synodical four meeting but with little headway.

7. After my devotional services did some work in getting ready for the Com. meeting left for Reading at 10:30 AM.

Must the first Monday in
February at 1 P.M.
Mr. Arthur Miller & I came
down for the 303 train
had dinner with Mr. Pitt-
house & his family at
405-9 Jackson St. Plita, &
spent the evening with
them very pleasantly.

8. He had a cold night &
this morning is still
threatening (the weather
has been very unpleasant for
quite a time, I very much
prefer the S. Day (Barnabers)
weather, did chapel work
& after lunch went to Audubon
Hq. & did courassing for a
time, but the wind got so
strong & so cold that I left
for Plita about 5:30, but
lunch & went to my room
& spent the evening indoors
did some work & got off
to bed a bit early I
needed rest.

9. Did some work ⁱⁿ my
room & then went down
town, Mr. Bisbace came
in & talk over the matter of
serving his relations with
the Kuhlberg church. Came
back & on lunch lunch to-
gether. Went to the Plita &
at 5:30 P.M. went to ~~downing~~
when I conducted the installa-
tion service of Rev. Mr. Steyer as-
sisted by Rev. Mr. Richard
delivered the charge to the
pastor, had supper with Mr.
John Brown & then family &
spent the night with them.
It was well daylight before
we got off to bed.

10. Spent the night ~~awful~~
oh - more of than usual
in a strange bed
enjoyed my breakfast with
Mr. & Mrs. Brown's family. Called

and a number of the teachers,
Lerru Fraisa went with me
to the station, left for Pluta
on the 9:41 AM train.
Came to my room and changed
clothes & went down town at-
tended to some clerical work
at my office & went to Andubon
N.J. & worked up to about 6 PM,
when it was so dark that
I came to Pluta & to my room.

11. Had a good night's rest, for
which I am thankful, went
to my office & worked during
the morning, but word that
the Uplift People had summon-
ed the skethen to appear.
Called on for first the lawyer
& showed it to him, he advised
to present the No. 20 for Child
salary.
Went to Andubon & worked until
about 6 PM, came to Pluta &
got my supper & then called
to see Dr. Fahlman, he not
being at home I came
to my room & worked & read

for a time but not about 11
PM.

12. Praised the Lord for another
good night's rest.
Went to E. Hanschman & ad-
dressed the S. School & spoke
to the congregation before the
Lord's supper was adminis-
tered & assisted the pastor,
Rev. Dr. Stubby, it was a pre-
cious service.
Was at the home of Mrs. Mayhew
for dinner & enjoyed their
fellowship again.
Went to Hadden's & called
at Mrs. Davis' - had prayer with
them - as he being sick, they
gave me their names for
church membership, made some
other calls & had a beautiful
converse with - at home
of Mrs. Schwanmiller (brother's)
Had supper at home of Mrs. Mayhew
11 PM.

It was midnight before I
got off to bed.

14. Had a good night's rest for
which I praised the Lord,
did some clerical work & came
down town, looked about
for furniture sales & visited
the Davis & Harvy auction
rooms to get an idea of the
values & made notes of the
same, visited several
of the furniture stores on
110th above market & got
their prices, also a second
hand typewriter store & a
stereopticon - can buy a
Smith Premier for \$16.50 & a
double stereopticon for
\$40.00. Got my evening meal
at the Mizpah (25¢) & my
coals at S. C. store 300 for \$1.00,
& went to Dr. Pahlman's, but
not finding him in ward
to my room & spent the
evening up to midnight
in writing up the (minutes)
report I made to the Syn-
odical Mission Com. at

Reading on the 17th night
& the resolutions relative
to the appointment of an Adver-
ary & Co-operation Mission
Com. in each Conference
for the better maintenance to run
off & duplicate in typewriter
form for the Conference.
It was 12:20 or later when
I got to my bed.

15. Had precious devotional
services this morning,
the Lord was especially
near to me, which always
brings great joy of heart,
paid for the pressing & change
of my coat (75¢) called
on Dr. Quanderoff & had him
treat my ear & throat again,
looked about for apartments
on a house,
did clerical work up to
12:30 - after getting my lunch
at the Mizpah (25¢)

cheap; but I was not in a position to buy, it is probable that you shall be able to get some bargains at these sales.

Went to Camden & called on Mr. Reynolds Bros; the Key-stone Bricks Co. had the satisfaction of securing the pledge of uplift in Custom or Audit ^{but #9} plant & val-ued at \$1000, as he will endeavor to suit us with another if that is not suitable or desirable for the people. Dear board I thank thee for thy favors & blessing, may this judgment be to the praise & thy holy name Amen & Amen. Help me to live the gratified life for all thy mercies & kindnesses which thou dost bestow so graciously upon us, & especially for the unspeak-able gift of thy dear son our Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen & Amen

Went to the Club - 60th & Market - & inquired concerning the rents & possibility of getting a house there, but supper on Market near 60th & they came to Board about station to meet my dear wife & daughter who arrived at 7:55. Thanks to the board for the care over them. Took them to St. Charles & Dr. Kaldman's where they were entertained. ^{conducted the night drive} I went to my room a bit later.

16. This was a sad morning, called at Dr. P's. & met my kind ones again. Mrs. Douglas joined me at the manse at 11:30, after I had done my clerical work & we looked over some furniture there & elsewhere. Some of the guests about 3 PM & went out to Temple manse for a little rest & I did my clerical work, & then

for a time & then went to my

17, Visited Holy Trinity Church,
Wilmington, Del., and ad-
vised the school & then
preached for Rev. & C. W. W.

20, Was at the doctors at 6^{1/2},

accompanied me to Verdun-
town where we were offered
his furniture for the two

him that we would
take it. Called later and
paid him \$30 on account
of same & engaged the flat

22. This evening had another
influx of my ear at bed

My wife & I went to the lecture on Justice given by Mr. Morrison at the Academy of Music & enjoyed it very much.

25. Attended to some matters down town. Met Rev. B. J. Jones & talked over his prospects & interests. Met Mr. D. H. Klein & Camden (St. Paul's) and discussed some matters pertaining to the work there, visited Bishop & Rev. Parsons.

1913 - Diary for February - 1913

1. This was a very busy morning
in arranging matters to get off
to my Sunday engagement. Did
some clerical work and left
for Harisburg at 3:25. Worked
at the compiling of a report
or rather statistics of our mis-
sionary operations in the Florida
Conference during the past 12 years.
Arrived at Harisburg at 6:15 or near
that time. Put up at the Common-
wealth Hotel & enjoyed my supper.
Mr. Minster of Massiah called &
we had a short conference.
Worked on my sermon and
report for the Synodical Com.
until almost midnight.

2. Had rather a broken night
rest, but am thankful for
all the good grace ever, from
about 7 o'clock & after breakfast
... ..

called for me & I reached
St. Michael's Lutheran Church at
10:21, 2nd ~~West~~ I Cor. 6 & 7
we on labourers of the world,
and presented the cause of our
Synodical Mission Work.
Having contracted a cold on my

the way to Libby's Wood at my
home & finished my report.
Met the members of our joint
Eden & had lunch with them
at the Y. W. C. A. Cafe. Had our

Com. meeting (Synodical).
It being a hot day we did not
go out to visit the park field
& view it as was planned.
Made my report as usual.
Wrote up my report for
the Home Board & sent it
off at 6 P.M. The Confer-
ence Com. served dinner
at the Synodical Com. at
Brown's Hotel, 8th & Chestnut,
at 6 o'clock after which the
Jut Com. was entertained at dinner.
I went then questioning the
wisdom of it. But as it was
a clean & numerous enter-
tainment I felt more com-
fortable although I still
question the wisdom of it.
For one example is so far

who will be influenced to
do even worse because they
say if the pastor does this

along the same lines.

41. Following our morning devotions I took Dr. Procter over the 59th St Springfield Ave. Field & then through the 60th & Baitman Ave. Fields. Then saw him off for Haverhill on the 11³⁰ train. Did some clerical work, endeavored to buy a typewriter, but prices of various second-hand stores, called on Mr. Wapline and asked him to loan me enough out of his benevolent fund to buy a stereopticon lantern, but to my surprise he insists upon buying it for me, this is certainly very generous of him, and I break the bond for his lovingkindnesses and tender mercies. Help me hold ever to remember all thy benefits & to serve thee with all my heart for Jesus sake, Amen. Went home for my supper, my dear ones gave me such a hearty welcome that it

caused me again to think the bond, Mrs. Procter came in and together we had a pleasant evening recalling some of the blessings the bond has showered upon us and the hope we had inspired in us for the work in N. America. We were all tired and sought rest as early as possible.

42. Following our worship I went to the doctor's for another treatment of my ear, then to Rev. Rutherford's & got my check for salary & expenses, came down town & did banking & some work. Mr. L. L. Smith went to Hudson to see Rev. Buschling concerning his views as to the Humberly Memorial field, but he had just gone out. Spoke to his wife concerning the matter & promised to be here here at 6:22 this evening. Came in & arranged for my stereopticon outfit. It will cost me about \$100.00. At 8:00 P.M. it

attended the Winklerberg Midweek service & conducted the service and the teachers meeting, had a real encouraging attendance at both services. Enjoyed the Fellowship & meal with my family at our new home this evening. My dear wife was feeling better for which I'm thankful.

6. Mr. Walsh attended to some matters at home, went to center & bought two books for my wife, did clerical work up to 12:30 PM, but lunch & then talked over some matters with Dr. Frank Hartman relative to our work.

The Joint Com. - composed of representatives of the several Synods & the Presby. Council met to determine the matter of our occupying the fields at 53 & Springfield Ave. Philadelphia and Audubon & Haddon Heights. They had a very long session. I went to the room and expressed my views on the matter. Finally the Council members

conceded our right to these fields and closed the meeting. I am thankful that this is over for they have held me back in my Audubon work for 2 weeks & a half. It is not right when they know they had no valid claims. Hastened to Commercial Museum and got slides on N. Am. and then hurried home & quickly got a bit of supper & went to bed. Could when I delivered my address on N. Am. Realized \$5.25 cents as my part, was very cold & I felt the effects of it much.

7. Did some work at home, returned the slides, called on Mr. Brandt & then at Oberlin's office. Dismissed the meeting of the Joint Com. with Mr. Chaffin & Dr. V. Corbitt & paid for two subscriptions to the Oberlin

Cost \$250 each & \$50 including postage each, Mr. Dr. Simpson's great check & bond, but not from Mr. Bartholomew concerning the services at Sudbury next Sunday & hastened over to H. H. Apple & Hudson arranged to have the services as arranged, left Sudbury at 4:30 for Chelsea.

With my family had dinner with Mrs. Dr. Schaffer & Mrs. Bose at the house of Dr. Pablinian, it was a very enjoyable companionship. We discussed the situation & Mrs. Dr. Schaffer expressed a fair but determination to give her money and life to the work in that land.

My dear wife took a faintly spell that alarmed us for a time, but she recovered sufficiently to return home for which we praise the Lord.

8. Helped put up some fruit jars in our barn & did some thing in the way of disposing with my correspondence.
