June 11. Shopping in Boroko & P.M. w. Nos, getting food, etc., & looking to buy a car. The Univ. provided us w. a car & driver for the day. I saw a Yamaha 80, new, for 225 \$ Aus.

June 12. At Univ. I had 2 meetings: Jim Nemmers & Rhys Healey.

Mike Greicus gave me another play to read & asked me to check it for spelling. Ros got me correspondence vis (fire, theft, damage to introy) for

June 21. I talked with Mr. Idnis of
the lang. dept. in the coffee room this
a.m. Later I asked Frans a
few questions about the extent of the
Univ's use of Pidgin & its interest in
that language.

Mr. Bouke called to say that it is
necessary for ~~the~~ Rose Kekedo to
delay our meeting until a later date.

In the afternoon I rtd the 2nd day to
Graicis, & we discussed it & the 1st one. I
found ^{all} Graicis's, An Introd to
Descriptive Linguistics, in the library this aft.

In the eve, Frans called for Rose &

June 24. Frans & I talked with Dr. K. S. Inglis, vice-chancellor of the Univ. at 2.30 pm today. It was good. Frans asked him about \$ for me. He replied that he would try sources.

There was a fine letter < Dick Adler (19 June '74), saying that my 3 bks are selling well, that 3000^{more} copies of Untangled will be printed. For which I am thankful.

Eddie Bule drove me to the meeting — Tok Pisin Sasaiti — at the Pat Muesky Teachers' College at 8 p.m. Rhys Healey, Sec., acted as chairman. He was good. Eng.

was the lang. of the meetg.

June 25. Dr. Scotter came in to discuss the car. At 2 pm I saw Eddie Bourke at Port M. Teachers' College; a bit later I spent about 30 mins with Rose Kekedo, the Principal. I was charmed. I ^{shall} meet w. her again on July 10, 8 a.m., to discuss the College's participation in ^{my} Pidgin program, using

June 26. I signed up, w. my check for \$4.13, for 6 months of Newsweek. Not bad. Dr. Scotter gave me the keys to his car, the ins. papers, & I did a trial drive. I went to the Wagan shopping center after work today, on my way home, I talked w. Jr. Nunevo over the phone about my ^{possible} Pidgin program (pilot projects) for the Port Muesby area. He is in agreement.

We have an appointment for July 8, 8 a.m.

June 27. Dr. Scotter is leaving tomorrow to beat the rescheduled airline strike beg. Sunday, so the car will be mine beg. tomorrow.

Ron & Rose Shaw came in today. They are engaged to be married. Rose came down \leftarrow Monday, bringing bks for the 4/1-5 workshop. There Ron, I met Graham Ho, a teacher soon to be working in Mt. Nagen. I talked w. Mike Greicus, over the phone, about the Pidgin used in 2 stories in Niugini Stories. At 9 (to 11) this a.m. the staff of the literacy workshop for the 4/1-5 days at Camp Sirimumu met here. The present were Frans, Jay McCarthy, Juan Gibson, Eddie Baseche, & Bruce. At 11.30 Ron called me about deviations to our house. Greicus came in to say that the meeting on 4/5 is at 8.30 a.m., will be over at 10.00, & that I shall talk ^{for 20 mins} on Pidgin for use on radio, after which Bruce Hoolu will talk on two vers. for radio. Then a discussion on panel.

June 29. It was a good evening w.

Ron & Ross. I prepared my motorcycle for the trip tomorrow, tightening bolts, getting gas, buying a tin of oil.

June 30 - July 4. Ross went to Sirehima w. Mary Ann & Jim Shea & Anika & Frans Diefrink. I went on the mtrey. The workshop & the fellowship were splendid. The students' (mainly 1st yr < the Port M. Teachers' College) grasp of Eng. is not good. I was surprised. I staid out to PM on my mtrey. on July 4, leaving the camp at 3 pm & arriving Hobila 5 pm.

July 5. At 8.30 a.m., Bruce Hooley & I spoke, then led a panel on the choice of lang. for use on radio. About 15 PNG & 3 Europeans were present. It went all right, I believe.

July 6. Ross & I got the car. In the evening, Mary Ann & Jim Shea & Frans & Anika & Ros & I went to the Indonesia, a restaurant specializing in food < that country. It was good.

July 7. On the left, has $\forall \exists$ to ^{me} the house we shall occupy later this month. It is nice. Nancy Lutton had dinner w. us this evening.

July 8. I met w. Jim Revere at 8 to describe the areas in which I am prepared to function as part of the Univ's extension svc. Later, Peter Burke of the Ad. Ed. Dept called to ask me to talk with Eugene Bushens of Lae on ^{his} the use of wuman vs meri in a coming Pidgin publication. EB was here in PM as we talked (on the phone). He accepted my view on using meri, not wuman.

Today I wrote to The Editor, OUR NEWS, Box 2312, Konedobu, for a copy of this twice monthly paper. I stood in the hall for more than 30 mins. this a.m., talking to Ann Jones about Pidgin. Her husband, Jim Jones, # r.m. 127, Ed. Research Unit, is doing research on if & how the vernacular can be used for teaching subjects like physics. I met w. Frans this aft. to give suggestions for future workshops.

July 9. I began to measure Pidgin words
 for to be copied to determine new words
 added to P < Eng. since 1971, the
 date of the last ^{Pidgin} dictionary. Glenys
Holland of Ad. Ed. came in to
 see about my training one of her
 student Ofos in NG Pidgin Literacy.

July 10. At 8 this a.m. I saw
Rose Kekedo in her ofo, as per
 appointment. It was a good meeting.
 I showed her the 3 NG Pidgin books
 & explained that I should like to see a
 pilot project run by 1 or 2 or
 more of her students. She was in-
 terested. I gave her Kipi's new publication,
 the one about the leaders of the new country.
 I called Reg Bond (44961, Exp. 68), Ad
 of Ad. Ed., & we shall meet today
 at 2.30 pm in his ofo. The meeting
 was a good one. He certainly does
 have problems, the usual ones: kepe-jeké
 1é na, wóllai lamaa 1é na; wai
 kwalegitie ta sa liizu.

July 11. By the way, rain Tues, Wed,
 # - 4 Thurs, or did it begin on Mon. There
 is a noticeable & welcome drop in temp.,
 but this town is damp. Frans, Bruce,
Jo Kueners, & I met w. the students
 who had attended the workshop. This ^{meeting} was
 at their college. It was good. The
 recommendations were accepted & it was
 decided that 3 students travel, one one,
 to the 10 Teachers' colleges, tell about
 the workshop & advocating ~ ones among
 them. Gevo's Sarufa, Adm. College, is
 probably the leading thinker among all the
 students. His interest is keen & he has
 initiative.

July 12. I give most of my attention
 today to the dangerous over-Anglization
 of N.G. Pidgin. I had a brief talk w.
Frans about my work.

July 13. I worked part of the a.m.
 on Pidgin.

July 14. as above.

July 15, Monday. This day is mostly on the vocab. of NG Pidgen. In the afternoon, Frans brought Pitr Fenton, full time lang. student, to see me about a course in lang. I gave him 3 possibilities: 1) do the 2 follow-ups for NAU; 2) prepare the material for, & institute, "30-minute" clubs; 3) prepare a format for a Pidgen-Pidgen dict. ^{to this list, but did not tell Pitr,} Later, I added: 4) a primer in Motu. After this meeting, Frans came in & we talked about my Pid. work through the ~~Kawiti~~ Tok Pisin Sosaiti. This would take 2 volumes at the moment: 1) I be available for training teachers to use NAU; 2) Vocab. of Pidgen.

Ros came to visit at 5.15 pm. We, with Ros, took a walk, then had supper & an evening together.

July 17. This is another day spent mostly on Pidgin vocabulary. In the afternoon, Jr Rumors came in to ask me to read an article (The Unesco World Literary Program) in Unesco's ADULT EDUCATION, Winter 1966. Frans came while he was here, & we briefly discussed the advisability of sending each of the 3 students alone when each goes to visit 3 other Teachers Colleges & speak about lit-lit in the vernaculars & Pidgin. Ron called while they were here to give me his new business phone no. & to invite me to go swimming.

Lnetta Todd gave me Rhys Healey's TOK PISIN Course. She mentioned his splendid grasp of gestures used during Pidgin speech. I called Healey to ask him about my part in the meeting of the Tok Pisin Sasaiti on Monday, July 22. Keith Johnson called to ask me to begin teaching about 10 Univ. students to use NAO on 12 Aug < 8am - noon for 5 days. All speak Pidgin & all are Keith's students, responsible to him. At the completion of the course (there will be more time ^{than} that noted above), the students, 2 each early evening (5-6 pm), will, for 5 nights a wk, conduct a literary class, using NAO, for a group of Sumatran living & working on the campus. Later in the day I discussed W. Frans my presentation of Pidgin Vocabulary Central to ^{be} presented to the Tok Pisin Sasaiti Monday night,

It was agreed that I serve as lecturer for an elective course in "NG Pidgin Literacy." I am glad. The 2nd meeting was at the Tok Pisin Sasaiti, also at PMTC. This was from 8 pm - 10 pm. I distributed my paper on excessive loan words & coming into Pidgin & English & advocating a policy of entree.
