
## PRESENTER BIO

Rush is a past president of the Oklahoma Speech-Language-Hearing Association. He has served as an editorial board member of *Infants and Young Children* and has published articles in the area of in-service training, coaching, supporting children and families in natural learning



environments, and teaming in early intervention. Rush coauthored the texts Coaching Families and Colleagues in Early Childhood Intervention, The Early Childhood Coaching Handbook, and The Early Intervention Teaming Handbook: The Primary Service Provider Approach. He has also written several book chapters on topics related to coaching and use of a primary service provider approach to teaming. He has consulted with more than 30 states and numerous programs across the country as well as internationally and provides training on evidence-based early childhood practices related to how to coach, implement a primary service provider approach to teaming, and provide early intervention supports and services within natural environments.
