Rush is a past president of the Oklahoma Speech-Language-Hearing Association. Rush coauthored the texts *Coaching Families and Colleagues in Early Childhood Intervention*, *The Early Childhood Coaching Handbook*, and *The Early Intervention Teaming Handbook: The Primary Service Provider Approach*. He has also written several book chapters on topics related to coaching and use of a primary service provider approach to teaming. He has consulted with more than 30 states and numerous programs across the country as well as internationally and provides training on evidence-based early childhood practices related to how to coach, implement a primary service provider approach to teaming, and provide early intervention supports and services within natural environments.



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
