Ann W. Kummer, PhD, CCC-SLP, is professor of otolaryngology and adjunct professor of clinical pediatrics at the University of Cincinnati, College of Medicine. She led the Division of Speech-Language Pathology at Cincinnati Children's Hospital for more than 35 years and grew the program to be the largest in the country. Kummer gives lectures and seminars, both nationally and internationally, in the areas of cleft palate, craniofacial anomalies, velopharyngeal dysfunction, and business practices in speech-language pathology. She currently teaches an annual course at five universities. She has written numerous professional articles, 22 book chapters, and is the author of the SNAP-R (2005) test for nasometry (PENTAX Medical). She holds a patent on the nasoscope, which is marketed as the Oral & Nasal Listener (Super Duper, Inc.). She is the author of the textbook, *Cleft Palate and Craniofacial Anomalies: The Effects on Speech and Resonance* (3rd ed.). Kummer has received numerous honors, including Honors of the Ohio Speech-Language-Hearing Association, the Elwood Chaney Outstanding Clinician Award from OSHLA, ASHA Fellow, and Honors of the Association from ASHA.
