ND250 is North Dakota's contribution to America's 250th birthday. Our goal is to support and inspire events, projects, and stories that reflect the Peace Garden State's unique place in the American story. From rural towns to tribal nations, every community has a role in shaping this milestone.

As part of your quick start guide, we've provided some themes to help us shine a light on North Dakota stories that connect us to the bigger national story and provide unique perspective in our role in building this nation. These themes are just a starting point and they serve to:

- · Support collaboration, coordination, and consistent branding across communities

## First Peoples & Living Cultures

Highlight the traditions of North Dakota tribal nations and their people. Celebrate art, languages, sovereignty, and ongoing cultural contributions.



### **Land & Legacy**

Explore how our rich soils, vast prairies, and rugged badlands shaped our state's identity, economy, and conservation ethic.



#### Innovation & Excellence

Recognize how North Dakotans have adapted and led change, from farming cooperatives and energy development to civic movements and immigrant contributions.



### **Celebrating Together**

Create shared experiences that connect neighbors, honor history, and strengthen community pride.

# LOCAL GOVERNMENTS & CIVIC GROUPS

- First Peoples & Living
  Cultures: Invite tribal representatives to
  share perspectives or cultural expressions at a
  community ND250 event.
- **Land & Legacy:** Dedicate a mural, historical marker, or project that connects your town's story to 250 years of American history.
- Innovation & Excellence: Highlight a local tradition of cooperation, industry, or community leadership through an ND250 proclamation or event.
- Celebrating Together: Feature an ND250 float, band, or special program in your annual community celebration.

### **SCHOOLS & YOUTH GROUPS**

- First Peoples & Living Cultures: Create a student art or writing project inspired by Native American history.
- **Land & Legacy:** Start a classroom or school garden connected to North Dakota's land and agricultural heritage.
- Innovation & Excellence: Students research examples of excellence from their own town or county such as a local leader, invention, or achievement that made an impact.
- Celebrating Together: Organize a student-led reading of the Declaration of Independence or a service project branded with ND250.



### **MUSEUMS & LIBRARIES**

- First Peoples & Living
  Cultures: Work with tribal communities to
  feature objects, oral histories, or art that highlight
  Native sovereignty and community connection.
- Land & Legacy: Create a display that shows how local landscapes and resources have shaped your community's story.
- Innovation & Excellence: Develop a mini-exhibit or program highlighting local industry, energy, or civic milestones tied to ND250.
- **Celebrating Together:** Host a storysharing event where residents bring photos, artifacts, or memories for an ND250 collection.

#### BUSINESSES

- First Peoples & Living
  Cultures: Partner with Native artists or
  entrepreneurs to showcase their work as part of
  ND250.
- **Land & Legacy:** Feature local foods, beverages, arts and crafts in a special ND250-themed event or display.
- Innovation & Excellence: Share your company's history of innovation or adaptation as part of a community ND250 spotlight.
- Celebrating Together: Sponsor a local ND250 celebration or provide resources to support community gatherings.

# CIVIC & SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS

- Partner with tribal nations to host a community learning event about tribal leadership traditions.
- **Land & Legacy:** Organize a community service project that supports the improvement of a community shared space.
- Innovation & Excellence: Host a shared community meal and highlight stories of immigrant families, civic leaders, or volunteers who shaped your community's history.
- Celebrating Together: Host a ND250themed challenge that raises awareness for ND civics education and continued education.
