Via Celeré and Ashoka Spain decided to partner for the future of cities. In a search for projects who could creatively develop solutions to guarantee the sustainability of cities.

They partnered with Bridge for Billions to support entrepreneurs in the development of their business projects while engaging Via Celere's employees as mentors in this social impact mission.

The challenge

In the EU the building and real estate industry consumes a third of primary energies, 50% of raw materials and 20% of available water having a direct effect in the increase of residuals and pollution.

So, how could Via Celere, as the leading Spanish real estate company, create the sustainable cities of the future?

They decided to take on the challenge, with the goal to become a motor for economic and social change within the real estate sector while strengthening their commitment to social responsibility.

To this end, Via Celere partnered with Ashoka Spain and Bridge for Billions to create "Future Cities", a program supporting young social entrepreneurs with business projects focused on making cities more inclusive, resilient and sustainable.

In order to make this initiative a company-wide mission, they needed to engage Via Celere's employees so that they could also contribute to the goal.

We needed to find a way to show Via Celere's employees that with their expertise in the industry they could have a huge impact in the development of social impact projects and the journey of young entrepreneurs.



The solution



To support Via Celere and Ashoka Spain in their mission, we created an incubation program for early-stage founders with solutions for the future of our cities.

We scouted 6 projects related to sustainability and found entrepreneurs working in solutions related to water consumption, energy, recycling and much more.

The projects had goals like reducing the negative environmental impact of cities, promoting urban planning and a more sustainable and respectful building with the social and environmental environment, raising awareness and promoting responsible attitudes among citizens or favoring the implementation of measures in favor of inclusion, the efficient use of resources and the fight against climate change.

Each of the projects got matched with a Via Celere employee as mentor, and engaged in weekly mentorship sessions.

Via Celere's employees played a crucial role in guiding entrepreneurs and providing much-needed insights on the real estate sector, through their guidance they were able to shape the projects into businesses with real impact.

During the 3-month incubation program, participants were able to develop and validate their social impact business projects through our step-by-step incubation program, from defining their value propositions to their 3-year growth and impact plans.

To really foster the sense of community and make sure that the learning was shared we hosted offline spaces where they could connect and find new growth opportunities.

All projects got to have visibility in press, social media, web and to present their solutions in a final event in front of key stakeholders and ecosystem partners. The 3 winning projects got up to 2,500€ scholarships to continue the development of their projects.
