<i>Calycanthus floridus</i> *	Carolina allspice	Part shade shrub
<i>Magnolia sieboldii</i>		Tree, sun
<i>Magnolia stellate</i>		Tree, sun
<i>Eupatorium purpureum</i> *	Joe pye-weed	7 ft perennial, sun, part-shade, wet
<i>Artemesia</i> spp, <i>Salvia nemerosa</i> 'May Night', <i>Nepeta</i> spp, <i>Centranthus ruber</i> , <i>Coreopsis</i>	<i>Artemesia</i> , <i>Salvia</i> , Catmint, Jupiter's beard	Perennials for hot, sunny, droughty spots
<i>Itea virginica</i> 'Henry's Garnet'	Virginia sweetspire	Shrub, sun, berries for birds
<i>Rudbeckia triloba</i> *	Black eyed Susan	Perennial, hot sun drought
<i>Echinacea pallida</i> *	Coneflower	Sun, drought, pollinators
<i>Echinacea purpurea</i> *	Cneflower	Sun, drought, pollinators, seedheads for birds
<i>Asclepias tuberosa</i> *	Butterfly weed	Hot, sun, perennial, necessary for Monarchs
<i>Potentilla fruticosa</i>	Shrubby cinquefoil	Shrub for hot, sunny, droughty areas
<i>Ilex verticillata</i> *	Winterberry holly	Shrub, wet, berries for birds
<i>Aster novae-angliae</i> *	New England Aster	Perennial, compact, sun
<i>Aronia arbutifolia</i> *	Red chokeberry	Hot, sunny, hedge, berries for birds
<i>Actea racemosa</i>	Bugbane	Part-shade, flowers in late summer, great scent, pollinators
<i>Clethra alnifolia</i>	Summersweet	Grows anywhere, flowers in late summer, sun to shade, wet to dry
<i>Dicentra eximia</i> *	Cutleaf bleeding heart	Shade, hummingbirds!
<i>Baptisia australis</i> *	False indigo	Native, legume (nitrogen fixer))
<i>Lindera benzoin</i> *	Spicebush	Understory, spring, spicebush swallowtail
<i>Asarum canadense</i> *	Wild ginger	Woods, moist soil, pipevine swallowtail
<i>Arctostaphylos uva-ursi</i> *	Bear-berry	Native, ground cover woody, berries for birds, erosion control, acid damp soils
<i>Viburnum trilobum</i> *	American cranberrybush	Medium shrub, pollinators, foliage, berries for birds, sun to part-shade
<i>Liquidambar styraciflua</i>	American sweetgum	Great fall color, strange fruits you can spray gold or silver for holidays
<i>Quercus bicolor</i> *	Swamp white oak	Shade tree for big properties
<i>Platanus x acerifolia</i>	London plane tree	Exfoliating bark, wet soils, streamside, roost for predators
<i>Betula nigra</i> 'Heritage'	River birch	Exfoliating bark, moist soil
<i>Hamamelis virginiana</i> *	Witch hazel	Aroma in Feb/March, few pests or diseases
<i>Chionanthus virginicus</i>	White fringe tree	Slow growing, great flowers, long bloom time
<i>Sambucus Canadensis</i> *	American elderberry	Sun, part-shade, edible berries, boggy soil
