Make a Kazoo

Supplies Needed

Heavy Paper (cardstock) Tape Markers/ Stampers Rubber Bands Wax Paper Scissors

What to Do:

- 1. Take a piece of cardstock (heavy) white paper and color/design anything you desire on the paper using markers and stampers.
- 2. Then tape the piece of paper into a tube (you can experiment with the size/width of the tube).
- 3. Next cut a square of waxed paper to cover the end of the tube.
- 4. Secure the waxed paper to the end of the tube with a rubber band.
- 5. Now practice humming into your kazoo.
- 6. It may take some practice and experimentation with the length, width, etc. of your plastic tube, but don't give up

Fun Facts

- The kazoo is based on the physics of how vibration makes sound.
- Humming causes a membrane (the wax paper) to vibrate.
- Kazoos were first produced in the USA around 1852.
- Kazoos can be made of plastic, metal, wood or other materials.
- Kazoos are musical instruments in the mirliton family.
- The 1920's was the "Golden Age" of kazoo play.

STEM Teen Leaders and Junior Leaders Program

Winter Inclement Weather Notice

If you have any concerns regarding the weather on the day of a 4-H event, please call 845-344-1234 during our business hours (8:30 am - 4:30 pm). For evening programs, please call after 2 PM and listen to the appropriate message. New members must be 9 years of age by 9/30/15. Dogs do not have to be registered, but they must be vaccinated for rabies, distemper, hepatitis, and leptospirosis. Enrollment forms are available from the 4-H office. Please request them by calling the office at 344-1234 or on the enclosed return form. There is an annual \$15.00 membership fee for all youth involved in any/or all 4-H programs. There is also an annual Dog Program enrollment fee of \$10.00 which is good for any and all dog programs if paid by March 2, 2016 (Thereafter the fee is \$15.00)

Registration will be accepted only when enrollment form, fees and a copy of vaccination papers are turned into the 4-H office. Note: All classes will be held at the Cornell Coop. Extension.

Dog Obedience & Grooming Classes

Orientation: Tuesday, March 29, 6:00 pm Cornell Cooperative Extension, Middletown

Monday Classes Start April 4 Cornell Cooperative Extension, Middletown

Registration for Dog Obedience is required before March 18, but classes fill up quickly – on a first come, first served basis.

Classes begin with a required orientation for all first year members at the Extension office in Middletown. Advanced Obedience classes will also be offered in Middletown.

IMPORTANT NOTE: These classes are designed as a youth development experience for children, not as a place just to get your dog trained. Dogs need to be controlled by your child, ie: a 130 lb. aggressive dog and a 60 lb. kid will probably not work out. Remember – the child needs to do the work, not the parent, to make this the great experience it can be.

Public Presentations Jump-Start Session

The next installment of family friendly dog workshops is available for your enjoyment. Come one, come all to this great public presentations jump start session. Shawne Demberg, a seasoned public presentation judge is volunteering to work with any interested 4-H youth in identifying, enhancing, and digging into your topic for the 2016 public presentation season. This will allow you to choose an engaging theme and really organize yourself and your ideas, with direct feedback from a long term evaluator.
