- Submit two (2) letters of recommendation.
- Submit a one to two-page essay describing:
 - your chosen course of study and how it relates to agriculture.
 - why you personally chose this area, including any factors in your life that influenced your decision.
 - your career goals, what you hope to accomplish in this area, and why you see this as contributing to the agriculture industry.
 - a person, experience, adversity, or achievement that helped shape who you are today and why.
- Submit proof of enrollment or acceptance into the accredited college, university, or school of advanced learning and, if you are currently enrolled, a recent transcript. If awarded a scholarship, a high school senior will need to provide proof of enrollment before a check for the scholarship amount will be issued.
