


Hudson River Almanac:



Funding Opportunities

Hudson River Estuary Program Grants

Approximately \$670,000 in competitive [Hudson River Estuary Grants](#) is available to implement priorities outlined in the [Hudson River Estuary Action Agenda](#) aimed at conserving or improving clean water; fish, wildlife and their habitats; waterway access; the resiliency of communities; and river scenery. This funding is provided by the New York State Environmental Protection Fund through two grant opportunities: Local Stewardship Planning, and River Access Improvements for People of All Abilities. All applications must be submitted in the [Grants Gateway](#) by **3:00 PM on July 12, 2017**.

Climate Smart Communities Grants

The [Climate Smart Communities Grant Program](#) is a competitive 50/50 matching grant program for municipalities to conduct climate change adaptation or mitigation implementation projects, or to undertake eligible actions as part of a strategy to achieve Climate Smart Communities Certification. Eligible implementation projects include those related to flood risk reduction. Applications are due by **4:00 PM on July 28, 2017**.

Clean Energy Communities

Designated [Clean Energy Communities](#) are eligible to apply for funding of up to \$250,000 to support clean energy projects, with no local cost share and with the option of receiving up to 25 percent paid in advance. To be eligible, communities must complete 4 of 10 priority actions. One is being certified in the Climate Smart Communities program. Free local technical support is available to assist in completing actions and applying for designation. **Open application until September 30, 2019, or until funds run out with free local technical support.**

Environmental Notice Bulletins

Environmental Notice Bulletins include SEQR and related notices, SPDES renewals, and completed DEC applications, as well as other related environmental notices for Dutchess County.

SPDES (State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) - The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) receives applications to renew permits for SPDES. Under SPDES, the DEC can control wastewater and stormwater discharges in compliance with the Clean Water Act.

Public Meeting on Review of Hudson River Cleanup to be Held in Poughkeepsie on June 28:

On June 28, 2017, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency will hold a public meeting at the Poughkeepsie Grand Hotel in Poughkeepsie, NY to discuss its second review of the cleanup of PCB-contaminated sediment in the upper Hudson River. This is the first of two meetings that are being held during the public comment period to present the findings of EPA's second five-year review and to answer questions from the public.
