Remember: Lead Poisoning Prevention is Doable. Lead Poisoning is Irreversible!



“This amount of household dust contaminated with lead-based paint can cause irreversible childhood lead poisoning.”

Lead Poisoning.... Doesn't Discriminate.

It can affect anyone, regardless of race, age, income, gender, schooling, or address.

Lead Poisoning.... Lasts a Lifetime.

Once a child's body and brain have been affected by lead poisoning, the damage is *irreversible*.

Lead Poisoning.... Costs More Than Money.

It costs communities manpower, time, and countless resources, and it costs our children their *futures*.

Lead Poisoning.... Is Everybody's Issue.

From parents to teachers, doctors to police, construction workers to elected officials...lead poisoning is everybody's issue.

WHAT IS “CLPPPP?”

CLPPPP stands for “Childhood Lead Poisoning Primary Prevention Program.” Oneida County receives special funding to help inner city Utica residents identify and correct housing conditions which can lead to childhood lead poisoning. Utica residents, tenants, and property owners can call us at 315-736-3394 x251 to see if they live in an area that is eligible for **free** services.


- ◆ **WHO:** CLPPPP services are available to owners, tenants, or landlords, regardless of income.
- ◆ **WHAT:** Participants may be eligible for **free** in-home lead inspections and testing, freebies and give-aways, advice on reducing the risk of lead poisoning, property work plans, free paint/primer or repair/cleaning supplies, nutrition/grocery tours and workshops, grocery bundles, bus passes, and tuition to an EPA lead renovator's certification course.
- ◆ **WHERE:** Properties must be within CLPPPP's High Risk Target Area in central Utica. Call to see if you qualify!
- ◆ **WHEN:** Services are available year-round, and in-home appointments can be scheduled at your convenience.
- ◆ **WHY:** It's simple! The CLPPP Program is called Oneida County's “PRIMARY” lead poisoning prevention program because the HOME should be our children's FIRST line of defense!

And did we say **FREE?** Everything is **FREE!**

SOME FACTS ABOUT LEAD POISONING

Lead poisoning has devastating effects on our minds and bodies, but is especially harmful to children through the age of six, pregnant women, and nursing moms. It's the law In New York State to test at age 1, and again at age 2. The most common source of lead poisoning is pre-1978 paint, or dust from painted surfaces released through friction. Also, there are other sources of lead that most of us aren't even aware of, for instance — some imported toys, spices, batteries, lead pipes, cosmetics, ceramic glazes, fishing gear, crayons, chalk, talcum powder, and vinyl blinds and shower curtains, to name just a few!
