CRISP Invasive Species ID & Management Workshop – April 20

4-H members or leaders interested in environmental projects may benefit from an upcoming adult program offered by Cornell Cooperative Extension Sullivan County. Citizen science opportunities such as <http://www.nyimainvasives.org/> and <http://blogs.cornell.edu/foresthealth/wasp-watchers/> are available for youth interested in tracking or monitoring invasive species. The **April 20** program at the Extension Education Center will take place from 12:00-3:00 pm. Learn how invasive species cause economic and environmental damage and can harm human health. Learn how to identify hemlock wooly adelgid, emerald ash borer, Asian long-horned beetle, Southern pin beetle, and oak wilt in your area or municipality.
