Geocaching is an outdoor recreational activity, in which participants use a GPS and other navigational techniques to hide and seek containers, called "geocaches" or "caches," at specific locations marked by coordinates all over the world. A typical cache is a small waterproof container containing a logbook and a pen or pencil. The geocacher signs the log with their established code name and dates it, in order to prove that they found the cache. After signing the log, the cache must be placed back exactly where the person found it.
