Steuben County Fair



4-H Cloverbud Ljyestock Fairbook 2018 Steuben County 4-H Cloverbuds can exhibit animals (Beef Cattle, Dog, Dairy Goats, Meat Goats, Poultry, Rabbit, Cavy, Swine, Sheep, Dairy Cattle, Horse) at the Steuben County Fair.

Must complete the County Fair Animal Cloverbud Entry Form by Monday, July 9, 2018.

Cloverbuds do not have to own the animal they show; the animal can be borrowed.

Cloverbuds are not allowed to compete for premiums and prizes, however they will receive encouragement and ribbons for their efforts.

Cloverbuds are not allowed to spend the night at the Fairgrounds, unless they are also exhibiting in Open Class and then it is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to supervise the Cloverbud member.

Cloverbuds must be chaperoned at all times while they are on the fairgrounds by someone at least 16 years old or older.

Whenever animals are to be moved and on show day, a parent or guardian <u>must</u> be present and assist the Cloverbud while showing their animal.

Cloverbuds may exhibit 1 ANIMAL ONLY in 4-H Classes! All Cloverbud animals must follow the 2018 Animal Health Requirements for Admission to the NYS and County Fairs that are at https://www.agriculture.ny.gov/Al/Fair Health Requirements.pdf and in the 4-H Fairbook. Please read all health rules and regulations.

We have tried to accommodate the Cloverbud families by partnering the Cloverbud shows with Open Shows of that species. Cloverbuds can and should compete in the Steuben County Fair Open Shows.

If competing in Open Shows, Cloverbud must follow open show rules and must complete an open class entry form and pay for entries and exhibitor ticket.

Cloverbuds who exhibit animals at the County Fair must complete a Cloverbud Animal Record and turn it in to the CCE Office no later than 4:30 p.m. on September 17, 2018.

DOG

Monday, August 13, 2018 9 a.m. 4-H Horse Show Ring Across from the track

There is no open dog show.

Dogs can be purebred or mixed breeds and must be at least 6 months of age. However, the following breeds or mixes of these breeds and any other aggressive dogs are not permitted: American Bulldog; Cane Corso; Doberman Pinschers (miniature Doberman Pinschers are ok); Husky: Akita, Malamute, Samoyed, Siberian; Mastiff/Bullmastiff; Pit Bulls: American Staffordshire Terrier; Bull Terriers; American Pit Bull Terriers; Staffordshire Bull Terriers; Presa Canarios, Rottweiler, Wolf Hybrid, and Fila Brasileiroe

There must be an experienced adult on the lead at all times.

The Cloverbud member and dog must have either participated in the 4-H Dog Obedience classes or if taking a dog obedience class privately must attend the Steuben County 4-H Dog Obedience Graduation to be eligible to exhibit at the County Fair. Contact the CCE Office for details about dog obedience graduation.

Cloverbuds are not allowed to show in a Grooming and Handling Class.

Cloverbud Dogs will be allowed to leave at the completion of their class.

DAIRY GOATS

Tuesday, August 14, 2018 in the Livestock Judging Pavilion

9:00 a.m. Showmanship Begins (Order: Senior, Junior, Novice, Master, Non-Owner then Cloverbud Class, followed by Breed classes)

There is no open dairy goat show

Cloverbud dairy goats may arrive Monday, August 13 between a.m. - 5 p.m. and will be released Sunday, August 19 from 4 p.m. – 8 p.m. OR Cloverbud dairy goats may arrive at the Fairgrounds and be checked in by the vet between 7:00 and 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, August 14 and then released to go home at the conclusion of its class. Dairy Goats must be contained by the exhibitor until the show.

Please indicate on entry form if your dairy goat will or will not be staying all week.

Dairy goats must be Does and be either purebred or recorded grades. Wethers, bucks and non-recorded grade Does are not eligible.

Dairy goats with horns will NOT be permitted to show. NO EXCEPTIONS. Must be born January 1 – June 15 of current year.

Dairy goats must be collared or haltered with leadline attached, and must be accompanied by an experienced adult.

Cloverbuds must wear white appropriate clothing including (No sandals, no tank tops, etc.)

MEAT GOATS

Tuesday, August 14, 2018 Livestock Pavilion

Noon Showmanship Begins

(Order: Senior, Junior, Novice, Master, Non-Owner then Cloverbud Class, followed by Breed classes) There is no open meat goat show

Cloverbud meat goats may arrive Monday, August 13 between 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. and will be released Sunday, August 19 from 4 p.m. - 8 p.m. OR Cloverbud meat goats may arrive at the Fairgrounds and be checked in by the vet between 7:00 and 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, August 14 and then released to go home at the conclusion of its class. Meat Goats must be contained by the exhibitor until the show.

Please indicate on entry form if your meat goat will or will not be staying all week.

Cloverbuds must wear appropriate clothing including, boots, slacks or jeans, and a nice shirt. (No sandals, sneakers, tank tops, etc.) Please read clothing requirements for 4-H members.

Meat Goats must be does or wethers born January 1 – June 1 of current year

Meat goats can be either registered or crossbred.

Meat goats must be collared or haltered with leadline attached, and must be accompanied by an experienced adult.

CAVY

Tuesday, August 14, 2018 1:00 p.m. 4-H Rabbit Barn

Cloverbud cavies can be brought on Monday, August 13 between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. and will be released on Sunday, August 19 from 4 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. OR can be brought on Tuesday, August 14th and released to go home at the conclusion of its class. Please indicate on the entry form if your cavy will or will not be staying all week.

Cloverbuds should wear long sleeve shirt.

Cavies can be any breed. Cavy must be at least 4 months old as of the opening day of fair (Tuesday).

Cavies should be tagged with an identification number to be put in the cavy's ear for identification purposes. 4-H members can bring their cavy to the Steuben County 4-H Rabbit/Cavy Clinic on Thursday, June 28, 2018 at 5 p.m. to learn about handling and showing cavies and to have their animal(s) tagged. Contact the office for clinic information.

DAIRY CATTLE

Tuesday, August 14, 2018

5 p.m. 4-H Dairy Fitting & Showmanship starting with the cloverbud class Livestock Judging Pavillion

Note: Wednesday, August 15, 2018 4-H and Open Dairy Heifer conformation classes will run concurrently at 8:30 a.m. (Cloverbud members can not enter conformation classes unless they are showing in open class). 4-H & Open Dairy Cow Conformation Classes will run concurrently at approximately 1:00 p.m.

Cloverbud calves must arrive at the Fairgrounds and be checked in by the vet between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Monday, August 13, 2018 and must remain on the Fairgrounds until release of animals on Sunday, August 19 from 4 p.m. - 8 p.m. OR cloverbud dairy calves can be brought in on Tuesday between 10 a.m. -4 p.m. to be checked in by the vet and be dismissed after its class on Tuesday evening or if entered in open class released at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, August 15. Please indicate on entry form if your dairy calf will or will not be staying all week. Cloverbud calves must be contained by the exhibitor until the show.

Cloverbuds must have an experienced adult on the lead at all times.

Cloverbuds are only allowed to exhibit a junior heifer calf born March 1, 2018 - June 15, 2018.

Cloverbuds must wear appropriate clothing including white pants and shirts and footwear. (No sandals, no tank tops, etc.)

SWINE

Tuesday, August 14, 2018

3:00 p.m. Cloverbud swine class

Livestock Show Ring - Behind Swine Barn

(4-H and Open Breeding Swine classes begin after the cloverbud swine class.)

Cloverbud pigs must arrive at the Fairgrounds and be checked in by the vet between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Monday, August 13, 2018. Pigs must be penned in the Swine barn and remain on the Fairgrounds until release on Wednesday, August 15 at 7 p.m.

Cloverbuds must wear appropriate clothing including, boots, slacks or jeans, and a nice shirt. (No sandals, sneakers, tank tops, etc.) Please read clothing requirements for 4-H members.

Pigs must be gilts or barrows born May 1st - July 1st of the current year AND be weaned before exhibiting them at the fair.

Pigs can be either registered or crossbred gilts or barrows.

Pigs must be driven by the Cloverbud and must be accompanied by an experienced adult.

POULTRY

Wednesday, August 15, 2018

9:00 a.m.

(Open Poultry Show is on Tuesday, August 14 at 8 a.m.)

Cloverbuds cannot show a meat bird.

Poultry (with the exception of doves, pigeons and waterfowl) must be accompanied by results of a negative pullorum typhoid test conducted within 90 days prior to exhibition or proof that the birds originated directly from a US pullorum-typhoid clean flock or equivalent flock. 4-H members can bring their bird to the Steuben County 4-H Poultry Clinic on Thursday, June 28, 2018 at 5 p.m. to have them pullorum tested for free and to learn about showing poultry. Contact the office for information on the clinic.

Participants should wear a long sleeve shirt.

Cloverbud poultry are brought in Monday, August 13 between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. and are released to go home on Sunday, August 19, from 4 p.m. -8:00 p.m. OR they have the option of bringing their poultry on Wednesday, August 15 and released to go home at the conclusion of their class. Please indicate on entry form if your poultry will or will not be staying all week.

SHEEP

Wednesday, August 15, 2018

10:00 a.m. Cloverbud Sheep class

Livestock Show Ring – Behind Swine Barn

(4-H and Open Breeding Sheep classes begin after the cloverbud sheep class.)

Cloverbud lambs must arrive at the Fairgrounds and be checked in by the vet between 8:00 and 5:00 p.m. on Monday, August 13, 2018. Lambs must be penned with the 4-H and Open Sheep and remain on the Fairgrounds until release on Wednesday, August 15 at 7 p.m.

Cloverbuds must wear appropriate clothing including, boots, slacks or jeans, and a nice shirt. (No sandals, sneakers, tank tops, etc.) Please read clothing requirements for 4-H members.

Lambs must be ewes born January 1, 2018 - June 1, 2018.

Lambs can be either registered or commercial ewes.

Lambs must be on a halter with leadline attached, and must be accompanied by an experienced adult.

BEEF CATTLE

Thursday, August 16, 2018

4-H Beef Fitting and Showmanship 11:00 a.m. (Order: Senior, Junior, Novice, Cloverbud, Non-Owner, Master followed by Breed classes)

(Approximately 1: 30 a.m. 4-H and Open Beef Show Market Classes followed by the 4-H Commercial Breed Classes & Approximately 3 p.m. 4-H and Open Beef Show Purebred Classes)

Cloverbud calves must arrive at the Fairgrounds and be checked in by a vet between 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. on Monday, August 13, 2018 and must remain on the Fairgrounds until release on Sunday, August 19 from 4 - 8 p.m. OR Cloverbud beef calves can be brought in on Wednesday between 7-9 p.m. or Thursday between 7-8 a.m. to be checked in by the vet and be dismissed at the conclusion of the beef show. Please indicate on entry form if your beef calf will or will not be staying all week.

Cloverbud Beef Cattle will be tied as determined by the Beef Barn Coordinator.

Cloverbuds must wear appropriate clothing including, boots, slacks or jeans, and a nice shirt. (No sandals, sneakers, tank tops, etc.) Please read clothing requirements for 4-H members.

Cloverbud Beef Calves must be Junior Heifer calves, or Feeder Steers, calved on or after January 1, 2018 – June 1, 2018. Calves cannot be part of a cow calf pair and cannot be bull calves.

Calves can be either registered or crossbred.

Calves must be on a halter with leadline attached, and Cloverbud *must* be accompanied by an experienced adult at all times while leaving the barn, during the show and while returning to the barn.

RABBIT

Friday, August 17, 2018 9:30 a.m. 4-H Rabbit Barn

Cloverbud members' rabbit can be brought on Monday, August 13 between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. and will be released on Sunday, August 19 from 4 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. OR it can be brought on Friday, August 17 and released to go home at the conclusion of its class. Please indicate on the entry form if your rabbit will or will not be staying all week.

Cloverbuds should wear long sleeve shirt.

Rabbits can be any breed. Rabbits must be at least 3 months old as of the opening day of fair (Tuesday).

Rabbits must have a permanent tattoo in the left ear; no adhesive tape or pencil mark will be accepted. 4-H members can bring their rabbit to the Steuben County 4-H Rabbit Clinic on Thursday, June 28, 2018 at 5 p.m. to have them tattooed for free and to learn about showing rabbits. Contact the office for clinic information.

Rabbits will not go through Livestock Sale

HORSE

Friday, August 17, 2018 Noon Show time is approximate

Exhibitors must have shown at one of the Qualifying Shows to be eligible to show at County Fair.

Leadline Walk/Trot

Leadline: The 4-H member is mounted and led by a side walker, who is 18 years of age or older and has horse related experience. A properly fitted halter must be over the bridle and a lead line must be attached to the ring at the bottom of the halter, not on the side or to the bit. Youth must be capable of holding the reins in their hands. Youth will not be asked to back their horse. Youth at this level <u>cannot</u> qualify for State Fair.

Walk/Jog-Walk/Trot: The child is mounted and must have a spotter present who is 18 years of age or older and has horse related experience in the ring (corners) the entire class. Youth must be capable of holding the reins in their hands and asking the horse to walk, jog/trot, and stop. Youth will not be asked to back their horse. Youth at this level <u>cannot</u> qualify for State Fair.

The 4-H member must wear an approved ASTM F 1163 SEI helmet and proper equestrian footwear having a distinguishable heel at all times when mounted or handling a horse in a riding arena whether on the ground or mounted. Riding attire appropriate for the seat being ridden must be worn. Please refer to

the NYS 4-H Horse Show Rulebook.

Special care should be taken to help ensure that the horse or pony is of appropriate size, disposition and level of training for the ability level of the child. Competent supervision, in a controlled environment, should be easily accessible to the 4-H member at all times when they are mounted. All riders, regardless of seat, can use snaffle bits and two hands on the reins in Leadline or Walk/Trot classes.
