4-H PARENTS AND MEMBERS

Parents Make the Difference in 4-H!

Parents and families play a critical role in the success of the 4-H program. Youth join 4-H to belong, to do things with their friends, to meet new friends, to have fun, to be recognized as a person, and to achieve. It is much easier for youth to succeed in 4-H and continue to grow when they have parental support and understanding. The leader can do only so much; children need the support of their parents.

It is our intent that parents will attend and participate in club meetings with their child. It is essential that parents serve as effective role models by helping youth keep commitments they make, assisting them to think through decisions, and see that they continue working toward their goals.

4-H is truly a family affair. Youth need adult guidance to encourage and direct them in their character development. As a parent, you can be a project leader, a coordinating leader, a resource leader, a chaperone, and a volunteer. All parents will assume some level of responsibility within their local 4-H club because all of us are busy and it is important to share the work load!

Why Parents Need to be Involved

A successful 4-H program takes the combined efforts of parents, volunteer leaders, and Extension professionals – great youth programs "don't just happen." Parents are essential partners on the 4-H team as we strive to provide quality, positive youth development opportunities. Active involvement and commitment is needed by each and every player for a team to be successful; parents included. Please don't let your 4-H team down – they are counting on you!

Research has repeatedly shown that parental participation in 4-H has many benefits including:

- 4-Hers do better work when they receive more personal attention from parents and leaders.
- Parents can encourage a "learn by doing" approach as they "coach" their child in activities.
- Families are strengthened when parents and children participate together in areas of common interest.
- 4-H clubs become stronger and more vibrant when parents are an active participant in 4-H.

How to be a 4-H MVP (Most Valuable Parent)

- Learn what 4-H is all about; keep informed on what is happening in your club and county.
- Show a genuine interest in 4-H and your club
- Attend the meetings and activities with your child; encourage your child to participate in a variety of 4-H events.
- Make 4-H a priority in your home read your 4-H mailings and email promptly and mark 4-H events on your calendar.
- Provide encouragement and help in your child's project work with record keeping, demonstrations, judging, and completion of attempted work – without doing the work yourself.
- Provide transportation to club meetings, activities, and county-wide events.
- Help to secure a meeting place for your project group and assist with snacks, refreshments, or other supports.
- Highlight your special talents by volunteering to be a project leader.
- Help members select, finance, and manage their projects.
 There are minimal costs for projects and spreading that equally helps to provide balanced opportunities for all members.
- Help the leader who is in charge of a project, be it a youth leader or another adult leader in your club. Everyone appreciates an extra hand for support.
- Help leaders locate and secure other qualified adults to assist as speakers or project leaders within the 4-H club.
 Everyone knows someone and many of those someone's can make fine project leaders on occasion – not everything has to come from within the club!

Remember: 4-H Members are the Focus!

The 4-H program utilizes the "learning by doing" approach as we work to develop the potential of each 4-H member. This means that 4-H members and their families must assume a greater level of responsibility for their own learning and involvement in program opportunities. We encourage you to make 4-H a great contribution to your child's well-rounded development through goals, long term planning, and active participation!

2018 NEW YORK STATE FAIR

August 21 - Sept. 3, 2018 Syracuse - Fairgrounds

State Fair is an opportunity for fun, leadership and learning. There are two ways for teens to be involved at State Fair.

Junior Superintendents (16+) work for the state office in longer blocks of time to help run the Youth Building. There is an application process for these positions and you work for the state office staff, not Orange County.

Teen Leaders (13+) work 6 hours a day in the youth building in a variety of capacities such as: Press Corps, Fashion Revue, Shooting Sports, GPS/GIS, County Booth or serve as an Evaluator's Assistant in a multitude of project areas.

New in 2018: Youth leaders are invited to register for the Activity Zone or County Booth. They work 3 hour shifts scheduled by state staff. Must have parental chaperone in place. Spots are limited and MUST be pre-registered like Teen Leaders.

Contact Ingrid if you are interested in attending State Fair, as there are several requirements in order to do so. Call early so you have time to fulfill those requirements.

For 2018, youth and teen leaders are being asked to purchase a shirt for their shifts. Please contact Ingrid ASAP to arrange at 845-344-1234 or imh23@cornell.edu.

Be a 2018 State Fair Teen Leader

To be selected, members must be 13 years old or older, and, within the program year:

Must: Have given at least a county level public presentation

And: Be an active member of the Orange County 4-H Program and/or Teen Leadership and Career Development.

Or: Speak directly to Ingrid to determine eligibility.

- At State Fair no Teen Leader may commit to participating in more than one event per day. If there is a schedule conflict, the teen must choose one or the other.
- Being selected to represent Orange County at the State Fair is a reward for hard work, good behavior and a good role model in any of the above areas and is an essential part of the selection process.

State Fair Selected Project Ribbon Awards

A youth with receive a rosette based on the number of selections received. Example, a youth with 1-2 projects receives ONE single ribbon rosette; 3-4 receives a slightly different rosette with a white underlay. The rosette size and look will differ as the number of projects selected increases. Each individual project still receives a "State Fair Selected" sticker on each entry tag.

State Fair Participants Meetings

Thursday, August 16, 6:00 PM Extension Office, Middletown, NY

All 4-H'ers who will be attending State Fair as Orange County Representatives are expected to be at this meeting. If they cannot attend, they must arrange to have an adult representative, preferably a parent or guardian, or, as a last resort, one of the 4-H leaders, who will be responsible to:



- 1. Arrange a time to tell the participant the information presented and the participant's responsibilities.
- 2. Represent the participant in transportation arrangements, dorm reservations, pass arrangements, signing of agreements, etc.
- 3. Pay dorm fees and any other charges.

Any participant not able to attend must also call the 4-H office and notify an Educator prior to the meeting. Participants who are attending State Fair must come promptly at 6:00 PM. Important State Fair information will be discussed at this time. These meetings will our last opportunity to discover any problems, answer questions, arrange cooperative efforts, etc. It's important to the welfare and happiness of all.

New York State Fair Action Booths

Clubs interested in the opportunity to run an Action Booth at the State Fair must contact Ingrid prior to July 1, 2018. Selections will be made based on participant numbers, handson project appeal, and available time slots.

Declaration Required by Mon., August 6

All adult travelers to State Fair are required to declare the following;

- √ drivers
- ✓ vehicles
- ✓ travel lists with days/dates to and from State Fair
- ✓ youth and adult dorm occupants/dates
- ✓ youth and adult hotel occupants/dates
- ✓ whether or not you are trailering

Declaration can be made by phone or on the State Fair Travel Return form (available on the 4-H Club Leader Resources page on our website), but must be received by August 6.

If your complete declaration is not received by August 6, you will not be assigned parking or fair passes. You are on your own to purchase them. No changes after this date and no exceptions. Finally, all adults staying in the dorms must have cleared the volunteer background check.



Instructions

- Take your canvas and object(s) you would like to trace outside. Place canvas and objects on the ground. Trace the outline of the shadow that your object makes on the canvas. You might need to move your materials around until the desired effect is what you want. Remember – the sun is always moving. You might also find that different times of the day will give you different effects.
- Decided which part of the picture you wanted colored. The part you don't want colored, use the painters tape to cover over.
- 3. Line your crayons on an edge of the canvas.
- 4. Using the blow dryer melt the crayons until you have the desired effect you want.
- Remove the painters tape to revel your shadow. You can either leave the shadow the color of the canvas or you can paint it.

You are all doing really great things and we thought that this might give you an opportunity to showcase your year for other clubs and the public. All clubs are



- ✓ Displays must include information on how to join 4-H.
- Displays can be set up anywhere that the public will see them. Places could include in stores, offices, town halls, libraries, or schools.
- ✓ Must submit a form to the 4-H Office declaring they are taking part (call for form). Form will include:
 - Name of club
 - Location of display (must give a physical address)
 - Description of the display
 - What you are displaying and why
- ✓ We will put together a list or map to put up on the website and in newspapers of all displays
- All members listed on the form will receive 4 hours of marketing credit.
- Displays MUST be up during the entire week. Displays can stay up longer if the location is amenable.
- 4-H Educators will travel around the county during the entire week evaluating the displays.

4-H SHOWCASE CORNER

JULY 21 - 29, 2018 - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Sample Agenda for a Club 4-H Showcase Meeting:

- 1. Review the General Rules in the Showcase Book. This will help avoid almost 99% of any problems which might occur.
- Review special entry information for animals and watch for deadlines. They are early!
- 3. Review each section of the Showcase Book relating to your club's specific subject matter entries.
- Write down all questions for Staff Reps or 4-H Educators. Make sure all questions are answered before 4-H Showcase.
- Show 4-Hers and parents how to fill out the double entry tags correctly. Extras may be ordered. They will also be available at 4-H Showcase.
- 6. Some important things to emphasize are:
 - Exhibits are entered at the exhibitor's risk.
 Every effort is made to protect exhibits.

- Double entry tags must be filled out in duplicate.
 Do not tear apart.
- ◆ Secure entry tags to exhibit so that the tag is not lost. Encourage 4-Hers and parents to watch their exhibits while they are judged.

Why Participate in the 4-H Showcase?

4-H showcases offer members the opportunity to celebrate their growth in many ways:

- Exhibiting helps youth learn to set goals and gain a sense of achievement from their work.
- ✓ Positive showcase experiences can build self-esteem and confidence within 4-H youth.
- ✓ 4-H members learn to communicate effectively about the work they have done. Communication is a critical life skill that will follow youth into adulthood.
- ✓ 4-H Showcase exhibiting reinforces what the 4-H member learned in doing the project.
- ✓ While preparing for showcase young people learn more about themselves and what motivates them. They learn how to make decisions, communicate their plans, respond and relate to others and they gain experience in time management.
- ✓ Participation in showcase also highlights the importance of fostering positive youth and adult partnerships.

Planning for Showcase

Has your club started thinking about preparation for showcase yet? Here are a few things to keep in mind as you organize yourselves and get ready to participate!

- ✓ Elect a person who will be responsible for picking up your clubs displayed projects when the showcase has ended. This person should have a copy of each member's Showcase Entry List to make this process simple and expedient.
- ✓ Showcase tags should be filled out completely and accurately before projects arrive to showcase. Be sure they are attached well and will not be lost during display.
- ✓ Please note no premiums will be paid in 2018.
- ✓ Clubs should elect ONE person for static exhibit pick-up. Beginning at 10 AM on Sunday, all projects MUST be picked up by 4 PM. Projects left beyond 4 pm Sunday will be discarded.

4-H Showcase Entries

All entry materials can be found in the Showcase Book. Exhibit Entry Cards are in the Showcase Book. Extra Entry Cards can be obtained by calling us.

Coordinating Leaders: All 4-H Members Exhibiting at 4-H Showcase must be enrolled at the 4-H office!

The Showcase Book is $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 11 " in size. All of the entry blanks are included. A sign-up sheet will accommo-

ENTRY LIST - All 4-H exhibitors will list their entries in numerical order by class. The sheet will be carried to each judge and marked with award given. Entry sheet will be turned in when completely marked. Please do not use the back of an entry sheet.

ENTRY TAG - The double entry tag has been designed so that all the information can be written on both sides of each double entry.

EXTRA ID NEEDED - To insure that each project gets returned, please use a white stick-on label or piece of masking tape to attach securely to back or bottom of each project. Sewing or soft craft projects might need safety pins to secure labels. Labels should contain your name and club name.

In order to prepare properly for the 4-H Showcase, here are a number of suggestions:

- One parent should be selected to be in charge of coordinating the Showcase for your club. Each club member should provide a copy of their entry list to their club's Showcase leader. The leader should be aware of all entries by his or her club. This will help assure all entries are returned to each member. That person does not need to be the Club Coordinating Leader, and the responsibility can be rotated from year to year.
- 2. All 4-H members and leaders need to be detail-oriented. The 4-H Showcase has many rules, deadlines, and opportunities.
- Set up a special meeting to prepare for the 4-H Showcase to include parents and members. It's suggested this be done in June.
- 4. 4-H members, their parents, and leaders need to be encouraged and expected to participate.
- Too often problems arise because the Showcase Book was not carefully read or not read at all.
- In order to enter a project, you must be an enrolled 4-H member. All fees must be paid.

CLUB REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

I'm certain that we can all agree how important it is to strengthen record keeping skills among the youth that we serve in our club programs as an essential task of adulthood. Today's message is a perfect example of life skills development being a critical function for all of us – not just the young people! While we **strongly encourage** record keeping among the youngsters, we **require** it of club leaders and that time is drawing near.

As a brief reminder, the end of the club year requires that each and every club within Orange County file a club financial statement detailing your club financial activity for the year, even in cases where financial exchanges may be zero dollars. This form may be found at our website:

In addition to the club financial statement, all clubs are asked to submit a Project Completion Record which is essentially a detailed attendance sheet of the projects you have done and the youth who have completed them. 4-H is required to report these project experience numbers to the state and we can only do that through your effective record keeping and submission of data. Carol or Ingrid may receive either of these records as your clubs wind down for the year any time between now and June 30th but it is essential that all clubs be accounted for no later than September 1st.



2018 Showcase Required Testing

If your 4-H Poultry project birds will be 4 months or older as of Thursday, July 26, 2018, you must have your birds pullorum tested. Poultry (with the exception of doves, pigeons and waterfowl) must be accompanied by 1) results of a negative pullorum typhoid test conducted within 90 days prior to exhibition OR 2) proof that the birds originated directly from a US pullorum typhoid clean flock or equivalent flock. Pullorum test negative poultry must be identified by official leg band.

Isolation on Returning Home from Showcase

Even though our Orange County Showcase has a small poultry show, 4-H members are encouraged to keep show animals physically separate from the coop or flock they have originated from for a period of at least two weeks after returning from the show. If any illness is noted in the exhibition animals the owner should contact their veterinarian immediately.
