Speaker: Mobee Weinstein

Maximize your garden's potential by planting vertically. Mobee Weinstein will talk about plants used for vertical elements as a solution to expanding limited space. Learn how growing plants on perpendicular surfaces can block an unwanted view while adding beauty and interest to your garden. Mobee will also discuss how to create distinct garden rooms using plants.

Mobee Weinstein, a Certified Organic Land Care Professional, graduated from NYBG School of Professional Horticulture and holds a BS in Plant Studies from Lehman College. She is a regular instructor at NYBG and an Adjunct Professor at Farmingdale State University. Mobee has television and radio experience and has been a judge at The Philadelphia Flower Show for 15 years.

Rediscover Untermeyer Gardens in Yonkers. The gardens are being restored to their previous grandeur. In 1915 Samuel Untermeyer hired William Welles Bosworth to design the gardens. In the 1920's, the press hailed it as "America's Most Spectacular Garden."

The gardens include water features, mosaics and an amphitheater with marble columns. The lower terrace opens to a staircase leading down toward the Hudson River with a vista overlook of the river. There is also a woodland trail leading toward an enormous rock folly called "The Temple of Love."

Take Saw Mill River Parkway (North or South) to Exit 9, Executive Boulevard. Take Executive Blvd. up the hill to North Broadway (Route 9). Turn left on North Broadway, go past St. John's Hospital, and look for the entrance to Untermeyer Gardens on your right.
