Research Study Seeks Youth Ages 12-18

Cornell researcher Kristen Elmore, Ph.D. with the Program for Research on Youth Development and Engagement (PRYDE) is seeking participation from 4-H youth aged 12 and up to conduct a study investigating youth’s belief about innovation and great ideas, particularly relevant to 4-H programming in STEM. The study seeks up to 300 4-H’ers, 12-18 years of age. Participation is voluntary, does not require any prior experience in STEM and involves the completion of a 10-15 minute survey. **Participants will receive a \$10 electronic gift card to their choice of Amazon.com, Barnes & Noble, or iTunes.** Parents/guardians who want their child to be eligible to participate must complete the online consent form at <https://cornell.qualtrics.com/4HScienceSurvey/Parents> and a link to the brief online survey will be e-mailed.
