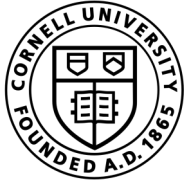

47th Annual Putnam County 4-H Fair



With every year there comes a fair, and now that August is here that means it's time to start planning the next one...

But before we do, let's take a look back at some of the highlights of the 2018 Putnam County 4-H Fair!

2018 Marked the 47th 4-H Fair here in

Putnam, and this year was particularly special. Not only was it one of our busiest fairs, with thousands of community members visiting every day. 2018's fair also marked the end of an era within our fair community. As some of you may have read, Marjorie Keith, the longtime Executive Director of Putnam's Cornell Cooperative Extension has announced her retirement. For 44 years, Mrs. Keith has worked on the 4-H Fair, bringing in community members from all over and inspiring hundreds to volunteer. While Marjorie had a hand in almost every aspect of the fair, her chief role was handling food services. In recognition of her over four decades of service to the community the 2018 fair was dedicated to her.

The 4-H Fair has had a long and rich history in Putnam County, with many different attractions having come and gone over the years, but one thing that has remained consistent are the animals. Animal Showmanship has become staple of the 4-H Fair, and the assortment of fun and sometimes eccentric breeds have attracted many people to our fairgrounds. Between our Livestock costume show (In which Dennis, a particularly adorable goat, was seen as Darth Vader) and our dog agility demos, there is something for any kind of animal lover. If you wanted a close up experience with one of these animals, the fair offered pony rides in our upper Horse ring. Or, if you were looking for something a little smaller our poultry barn had a wonderful assortment of chickens, geese, and turkeys. All of the animals on our fairgrounds are cared for by local community members and our 4-H clubs. These Clubs allow kids to gain hands-on skills and learn countless things about agriculture, while building a sense of community and team work.

If animals are not your thing, the fair was also filled with some magical people... literally! Tony's World of Magic has graced our fair for decades, combining magic, science, and most importantly humor to create a wonderful show for all ages. Tony

started as a club leader, and parent volunteer. Now, with his kids out in the real world, Tony continues to run 4-H clubs and donates his time to creating magic for all to see. Neighboring Tony's magical world is the Creative Corners tent. This space is a wonderful attraction where you create beautiful art while learning hands-on skills. Of course you could also get your Face Painted by members of our 4-H Face Painting Club.

No fair would be complete without live music! The Shady Grove Theater, our outdoor stage is located right near the Fair entrance, and can be heard throughout the fair. This weekend featured a wonderful assortment of performers, from renowned musicians like David Amram, Educational Programs like Kelly Oster's School of Irish Dance, and up-and-coming bands like RGK. The music filled the fair with a wonderful feeling, you could see fairgoers bopping along as they got their corn or cotton candy.

Speaking of Food; Food! What wasn't to love between the fresh grilled corn and the amazing chicken barbeque, there were options for all kinds of picky eaters, aficionados, and just people looking for a good bite. This year was particularly successful, we sold out of Ice Cream, Cotton Candy, Corn, and Lemonade! The Chicken Dinner sold every available ticket, and we restocked our hot dog cart on multiple occasions. Food in hand, one was free to walk around and enjoy some of our outdoor attractions including a collection of antique tractors and our "touch a truck" where kids could explore professional vehicles found throughout our community.

Of course, this fair would not be possible if it weren't for the countless number of volunteers that continue to support our program. 4-H builds families. Or more accurately, it builds a family. This fair has connected so many people and created wonderful opportunities for growth and development. 4-H volunteers gain the skills to take on internships and college, with many alumni returning to serve as Interns for CCE. This family of volunteers and fairgoers are brought together by a love of community and an interest in making the best better! So Thank you to all the fair goers, volunteers, and passerbyers for making this fair the best yet.

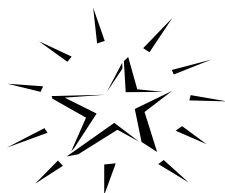

Join Cornell Cooperative Extension of Putnam county's Master Gardener Volunteers on a free guided hike!

Here in Putnam County there are so many beautiful natural places to explore. Numerous studies link walking in nature with improved mental and physical health, as well as stress relief. Cornell Cooperative Extension of Putnam County's Master Gardener Volunteers have guided four hikes so far & will guide two more. Come learn more about natural heritage and discover the beauty of Putnam County.

These free, guided hikes will explore land-use, history, and invasive plants. On the second Saturday of each month (rain date the following Sunday) participants will embark together for a 1 ½ to 3 hour hike, depending on the location and the speed of the group. National 4-H Week

Support 4-H and show the Putnam Community the Power of YOUth! Here is how you can help:

1. **Celebrate 4-H Week by coming to the 4-H Family Fun BBQ!**
2. **4-H Displays.** Set up a display in a store window, on a table, or a floor in a restaurant, school, bank, library, in front of your home, or anywhere else the general public can view it. (Be sure to get permission first.) A display can be about 4-H in general or about your 4-H club, a club's or an individual member's 4-H community service project or other 4-H project work. (*Remember it must say 4-H and/or have the clover leaf prominently exhibited. Don't forget to include Cornell Cooperative Extension of Putnam County.*)
3. **4-H Posters, Banners, or Bulletin Boards.** These items also can be set up in schools, restaurants, banks, libraries, store windows, etc., and can be on the same topics as a 4-H Display. It may contain photographs, with captions.
4. **Contact the editor of the local papers.** This is an opportunity to let the community know that 4-H exists in Putnam, what 4-H is about, and how much 4-H means to you.
5. **Email your County and State Representatives.** It is important to let elected County and State representatives know your appreciation for the government funding 4-H receives and how your club has made a difference in the community.
6. **Wear your 4-H shirt, hat or pin.**
7. **Ask your teacher if you can talk about your involvement in 4-H to your class at school.** Hand out 4-H pamphlets which are available at our office.
8. **Display the 4-H clover at your home.**
9. **Come to Youth Achievement Day** and show your support to all of the youth who have actively committed their Head, Heart, Hands and Health to the Putnam community.
10. **Let us know what you do so that we can thank you for your hard work and support!**
