Code Your World – National Youth Science Day

Beginning October 1, the National 4-H Council is challenging youth across the nation to participate in National Youth Science Day activities in coding for computer science. In addition to the computer based “Animate a Name” activity there will also be three unplugged activities available to engage in: “Code Your Dance” (teaching algorithms), “Artificial Intelligence” (learn random number generation) and “Color Your World” (pattern recognition with maps).
