4-H Snowmobile Safety Course for Kids

LIBERTY, NY— New York State Law requires that children age 10 to 17 must carry a snowmobile safe operator's certificate at all times when operating a snowmobile without the supervision of an adult.

Cornell Cooperative Extension Sullivan County (CCESC)'s 4-H Youth Development program will host its annual Snowmobile Safe Operator's Course for youth aged 10-17 on Saturday, February 9, 2019. The program will be held from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm at the Extension Education Center on 64 Ferndale-Loomis Road in Liberty.

A parental consent form signed by a parent or guardian is required for each participant. Attendees should bring a bagged lunch and a pencil to the program.

Cost of the course is \$8 per youth or \$5 per 4-H member. Fees will be donated to the 4-H program.

Space is limited and registration with non-refundable payment is required in advance by visiting www.sullivancee.org/events, emailing sullivan@cornell.edu, or calling CCESC at 845-292-6180. Payment can be made by check, cash, or credit. Additional donations for CCESC programs are appreciated.
