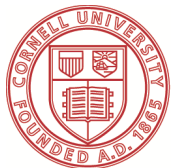

Vincent will be discussing species selection on Long Island and tree identification.

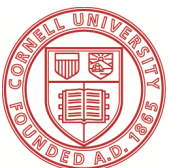
Diana Cristiano, Program Health/Safety Coordinator & Tree Climber, USDA
