LIBERTY, NY— Youth with an interest in veterinary science, between the ages of 8 and 18, can engage in a hands-on Veterinary Science educational opportunity this spring. Cornell Cooperative Extension Sullivan County (CCESC) is offering a three-part 4-H Youth Development program series on Thursdays April 25, May 2, and May 9, 2019 from 6:30 to 8:00 pm. 4-H programs are always open to non-members.
