Cardoon	'Porto Spineless'	<i>Cynara cardunculus</i>	x		100	36-48"	Edible if blanched with flavor similar to artichoke; if left unharvested, produces large purple, thistle-like flowers; silver-green leaves are sharply lobed and serrated; hardy to Zone 6.
Cucumber	'Burpees Pickler Hybrid'	<i>Cucumis sativus</i>	x		53	6-8"	High yield, early maturing, black-spined cucumber; medium-green, 3½-5" fruits have blunt tips; excellent in all sizes; a top selection for flavor, performance and adaptability; spreads to 24"; tolerates cucumber mosaic virus.
Cucumber	'Iznic (F1)'	<i>Cucumis sativus</i>	x		55-58	8-12"	Very thin skinned crisp fruits with excellent flavor; spineless, seedless, dark green snack-sized; compact vines with small leaves; best picked daily when 3-4"; gynocious (100% female flowers) and parthenocarpic (no pollination needed); high resistance to powdery mildew and scab.
Cucumber	'Sweet Burpless Hybrid'	<i>Cucumis sativus</i>	x		55	6-8"	Very high yield due to large number of female flowers; smooth, deep green cucumbers are 10" long with a mild refreshing flavor; spreads to 36"; resists downy and powdery mildew.
Cucumber, Armenian	'Painted Serpent'	<i>Cucumis melo</i> var. <i>flexuosus</i>	x		55-75	36"	A variety of muskmelon, this fruit looks and tastes like cucumber; also known as "striped Armenian cucumber"; burpless; can grow up to 36" long - best harvested at 15"; curls into snake-like shapes; light green fruit with dark green stripes; mild flavor, no need to peel.
Eggplant	'Amadeo'	<i>Solanum melongena</i>	x		65	3 feet	Moist, well-drained soil; known for huge yields of tender, nutty, bitter-free fruit on spineless plants; well-branched and vigorous; support probably needed once it begins bearing the heavy (5" wide, 8"long) dark purple to black eggplants because the yield is too great for this compact plant to hold up alone; easy to pick and delicious.
Eggplant	'Pingtung Long'	<i>Solanum melongena</i> var. <i>esculentum</i>	x		65-75	18-36"	Asian heirloom; beautiful, dark lavender skin and white flesh; elongated, slender ½ lb. fruits average 10" long and 1-2" across; mild flavor is great for stir frying; disease resistant; tolerant of wet and hot conditions.
Kale	'Redbor'	<i>Brassica oleracea</i>	x		55	12-18"	Finely curled purple-green leaves with red veins turning all red in cool weather; beautiful in the garden and sweet to eat especially after first frost; grows best in cool weather; benefits from afternoon shade; very cold hardy; a good fall crop; full sun to part shade.

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Kale	'Winterbor'	<i>Brassica oleracea</i>	x		65	24-36"	Frilly blue-green leaves are attractive and tasty; tall and up to 24" wide, a great producer; one of the most winter hardy kales; great for early spring and late fall harvest; sweet and juicy after frost.
Pepper, Hot	'Havasu (F1)'	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	x		60 yellow/ 80 red ripe	24-36"	High yielding Santa Fe type pepper; thick walled conical fruits are avg. 3" x 2"; commonly stuffed like poblanos but spicier; usually harvested pale yellow but also can be used orange or red.
Pepper, Hot	'La Bomba' Jalapeno	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	x		55 green, 70 red	24-36"	A high-quality jalapeno with good flavor and medium heat; large, 2-3/4" long by 1" wide, dark green fruits have thick walls with little to no etching and are great fresh or used for 'poppers; strong, upright plants have a sturdy main stem for easy harvest, plus a dense leaf canopy to help prevent sunscald; resists Potato Virus Y. Good for container gardening.
Pepper, Mildly Hot	'Highlander (F1)'	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	x		65 green/ 85 red ripe	24-36"	Mild pepper; traditional, semi-flattened, mostly two-lobed fruits average 7" x 2"; large, tall plants; early and adaptable; bred to have good productivity even in cooler regions where Anaheim type peppers often are shy yielding; fruits ripen to red but are usually used green for stuffing, grilling, or roasting.
Pepper, Sweet	'Ace (F1)'	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	x		50 green/ 70 red	18-24"	Highly productive yields of 3-4 lobed medium-sized fruits; glossy green fruits turn red early; performs well in cool climates where bell peppers are difficult to grow; grows well in containers; flavor sweetens as peppers change from green to orange to red; apparent tolerance to blossom drop since nearly every flower produces a pepper.
Pepper, Sweet	'Carmen (F1)'	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	x		60 green/ 80 red ripe	28"	Sweet, tapered 5 oz. peppers avg. 6" long x 2½" wide; upright, medium-size plant; great for salads, roasting, sautéing; early, productive, and delicious.
Pepper, Sweet	'Cupid (F1)'	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	x		55 green/ 75 red ripe	24-36"	Early, sweet mini-bell pepper avg. 2" x 2", large, well branched plants protect fruit from sunscald; fruit is particularly sweet when red.
Pepper, Sweet	'Escamillo (F1)'	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	x		60 green/ 80 yellow ripe	24-28"	Large, sweet, golden yellow fruit; excellent taste either raw, cooked or fire roasted; tapered with lobed shoulders, 6" long by 2-2½" wide; compact growth habit; 2016 AAS winner.
Pepper, Sweet Heirloom	'Jimmy Nardello'	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	x		80-90	20-24"	Spectacularly tasty, sweet frying pepper; introduced from Italy in 1887; plants produce loads of 10", thin peppers; cook in a little olive oil, grill, chop and sautee with other vegetables, or use raw in salsas and salads; perfect for pickling or drying.
Pepper, Sweet	'Tangerine Dream'	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	x		70-80	12-18"	Low-growing spreading plants with dark green foliage and bright upright fruit are both ornamental and culinary; fruit is sweet, mild, and grows in clusters of three to four; use fresh or cooked; average water needs.

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Pepper, Sweet Shishito	'Mellow Star'	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	x		60 green/ 80 red ripe	24-30"	Thin walled heavily wrinkled fruits, 3 ^{1/2} to 4"; mild flavored when green, slightly sweet when red; suitable for tempura, great for stir fries and salads; large upright plants; avoid excess nitrogen; pick first peppers promptly when at full size to encourage further fruit set.
Squash, Summer	'Burpee's Best Hybrid'	<i>Cucurbita pepo</i>	x		40	28-30"	Very high yield, early harvest, deep green zucchini are 6-8"; fruits are a rich, buttery flavor with refined texture; spine-free plants are exceptionally vigorous; spreads 5-6 feet.
Squash, Summer	'Cosmos Hybrid'	<i>Cucurbita pepo</i>	x		60	40"	Bright yellow straight-necked zucchini-type squash with a bright, sweet, nutty flavor; fruit is 6-8" long x 1" wide; vigorous, high-yielding bush plants with very few spines; spreads 2-3 feet.
Squash, Summer	'Jackpot Hybrid'	<i>Cucurbita pepo</i>	x		42	12-18"	Medium dark-green zucchini are 6-8"; delicate mild flavor and creamy texture, especially if picked young; speckled, long, straight, smooth fruit sets well all season; plentiful yields on space-saving vines, which spread 30".
Squash, Summer	'Sunburst (F1)'	<i>Cucurbita pepo</i>	x		52	4-6 feet	Patty Pan squash; small bright yellow scalloped fruits with green blossom ends; mild tender white flesh; best harvested at 3" yet still tender when much larger; steam, bake, grill, sauté or enjoy fresh slices with dip.
Squash, Winter	'Early Acorn Hybrid'	<i>Cucurbita pepo</i>	x		75	10-12"	Dark green fruits have sweet, nutty, orange-yellow flesh with a smooth texture; semi-bush type plants bear five large 5" squash; spreads 4-5 feet.
Squash, Winter	'Honeynut'	<i>Cucurbita moschata</i>	x		110	7-10 feet	Mini-butternut with sweet, fine textured and deep orange flesh; 4-5" fruit are usually 1/2 to 1 pound; bright green rinds turn beige to orange when ripe; high-yield plants are semi-vining and disease resistant; stores well; self-fertile; bred by Cornell University.
Squash, Winter	'Vegetable Spaghetti'	<i>Cucurbita pepo</i>	x		100	10-12"	Medium-sized spaghetti squash; 3-4 lb. oblong fruits are a tasty, healthy and fun alternative to traditional pasta; fertilize when fruits form to increase yield; can be stored several months in a cool, dry place; spreads 4-5 feet.
Squash, Winter	'Waltham Butternut'	<i>Cucurbita moschata</i>	x		85	10-12"	Delicious squash with solid and dry interior; improved fruit uniformity and yield; pick young and use like summer squash or let mature to 12-15" and 6 lbs.; excellent for storing, spreads 4-5 feet.
Sweet Potato	'Purple'	<i>Ipomoea batatas</i>	x		90	6-10"	Heirloom sweet potato variety grown for its edible tubers; purple skin and flesh; vines 4'-6' long have dark green foliage with purple stems; space 12" apart in warm, deep, well loosened soil; can yield over 4 pounds per plant; full sun, loves heat; cook tubers in the skin to retain the deep purple color; not as sweet as commercial orange varieties; requires deer protection.

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Tomatillo	'Toma Verde'	<i>Physalis philadelphica</i>	x		60	3-6 feet	Early-maturing, large flat-round green fruit; tart flavor when young, becoming sweeter as it ripens; grow plants like tomatoes; plants need staking; fruits are ready to harvest when husks split and fruit color changes from a yellow green to medium green; perfect for Salsa Verde or as a special addition to any Mexican dish. <u>Semi-determinate.</u>
Tomato	'Crimson Carmello (F1)'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		70	n/a	Exquisite tasting, French hybrid tomatoes bred especially for fresh eating. Round, red, juicy fruits on tall, vigorous, disease resistant, widely adapted vines; shows less septoria and early blight than most; resistant to Nematodes, Tobacco Mosaic Virus, Fusarium and Verticillium Wilt. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato	'Defiant PhR (F1)'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		70	3-4 feet	Named for its defiance of most troublesome tomato diseases including late blight; 6-8 oz., round, mid-sized slicing tomatoes are smooth and medium-firm with good texture and great flavor; deep red internal and external color; high-yielding, medium-sized plants; resistant to Fusarium Wilt and Verticillium Wilt; <u>intermediate resistance to early blight and high resistance to late blight.</u> <u>Determinate.</u>
Tomato	'Fourth of July'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		49	n/a	Named for its promise of ripe fruit by Independence Day; produces plentiful 4 oz. tomatoes all season long; better-than-average taste improves as season progresses; plants bear fruit until frost; skin can be thicker-than-normal and occasionally cracks; excellent for slicing. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato	'New Girl (F1)'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		62	n/a	Very early, great sweet flavor; fruits avg. 4-6 oz. and hold well; delicious on sandwiches or in salads; high resistance to Fusarium Wilt races 1 and 2, and Verticillium Wilt. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Beefsteak	'Big Beef Hybrid'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		73	n/a	Old-time tomato flavor; smooth, round 9-16 oz. fruits; large fruit size and yield; superior disease tolerance; tolerant of, or resistant to, Verticillium Wilt, Fusarium Wilt races 1 and 2, Tobacco Mosaic Virus, Root Knot Nematodes, and Stemphylium (Gray Leaf Spot). <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Cherry	'Chocolate Cherry'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		70	n/a	Extremely flavorful, uniform, 1" chocolate-red fruits in trusses of 8 which hold stems well; skins don't crack; can be picked several days before maturity and allowed to ripen off the vine without sacrificing quality. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Cherry	'Jasper (F1)'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		60	n/a	New! Small, deep red cherry resists late blight; round, bite-sized fruits are crack resistant, borne on small trusses, and store on the plant well, resisting cracking and rot; pleasantly chewy texture, and sweet, rich flavor; plants are extra vigorous and tall, staying healthy for a long picking period; <u>intermediate resistance to late blight and early blight.</u> Septoria Leaf Spot, Fusarium Wilt. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Cherry	'Rapunzel'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		68-70	n/a	Long, cascading trusses with up to forty fruits; sweet, flavorful, bright red fruits (3/4-1 ounce), excellent for salads. <u>Indeterminate.</u>

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Tomato, Cherry	'Sungold (F1)'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		57	n/a	Very early, and a heavy cropper; exceptionally sweet, bright tangerine orange-colored fruits on vigorous long-blooming plants; thin-skinned, bite-sized fruits with a juicy flesh that holds its sweet, fresh-from-the-vine flavor, resistant to Fusarium Wilt (Race 1) and Tobacco Mosaic Virus. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Cherry	'Sweet Million Hybrid'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		60	n/a	Long chains of smooth, dark red, 1-1½", very sweet, and crack resistant fruits; large vigorous plants; fruits early maturing and continue producing until frost; resistant to Fusarium Wilt race 1, Nematodes, Tobacco Mosaic Virus, and Leafspot. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Cherry	'White Cherry'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		59	n/a	Pale yellow cherry tomato average 1 1/8" to 1¼" diameter with mild taste; easy to pick off compact plants. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Heirloom	'Amish Paste'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		74-90	n/a	Deep red fruits avg. 8 oz.; best for sauces and canning; not overly acidic. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Heirloom	'Black Krim'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		69-90	n/a	Heirloom from Russia; large, dark, deep red, almost shiny black with heavy green shoulders; deep, reddish-green interior; 10-12 oz.; rich in flavor - sweet and tasty; matures extremely early. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Heirloom	'Brandywine'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		90-100	n/a	Large, luscious fruits with deep pink skin and smooth red flesh; can weigh over a pound each; suburb, award-winning, sweet flavor; plant is best staked or caged. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Heirloom	'Costoluto Genovese'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		78-90	n/a	Vigorous plants produce heavily lobed, firm, fleshy fruits weighing up to 7 oz. with robust, tangy, sweet flavor and high acidity; Italian favorite for sauces or juice also delicious sliced; good disease resistance. Thomas Jefferson planted these from 1809 until his death in 1826. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Heirloom	'Kelloggs Breakfast'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		80-85	n/a	Large, orange, beefsteak type (up to 16oz.); long-season producer; meaty, juicy, delicious; truly orange in color; great for salads, sandwiches. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Heirloom	'Mortgage Lifter'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		75-85	n/a	Developed in the early 1930's; large, meaty fruits with few seeds; mild, sweet flavored tomato is great for sandwiches and salads; good yields of very large, smooth, pink-skinned fruits even in droughts. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Heirloom	'Prudens Purple'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		75	n/a	Large, 10 - 16 oz., slightly flattened, blemish-free, dark pink, nearly purple fruits with few seeds on large potato leaved vines; mature quite early; delicious flavor and good production; great for hot day and cool night climate. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Heirloom	'Stupice'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		52	n/a	Sugary sweet, red, slightly oval, 2 inch fruit, weighing 1 to 2 oz.; excellent choice for first-of-the-summer salads, snacks, and juicing; bred in the former Czechoslovakia, where its extreme earliness, tolerance to cold, superior flavor and high yields have earned it worldwide attention; tests show an average of 87 fruits picked per plant. <u>Indeterminate.</u>

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Tomato, Heirloom	'Woodle'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>			75		Large, round, smooth fruits are nearly perfect in shape; brilliant tangerine color; good yield; has an incredible rich and sweet complex flavor that is among the best. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Plum	'Granadero (F1)'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		75	n/a	Vigorous plants with high yields of bright red 4-5 oz. fruit with very good flavor; thick-walled fruit are good for sauces, salsas and salads; high resistance to Fusarium Wilt races 1 and 2, powdery mildew, Tobacco Mosaic Virus, Verticillium Wilt; and intermediate resistance to nematodes and Tomato Spotted Wilt Virus. Low susceptibility to blossom end rot. <u>Indeterminate.</u>
Tomato, Heirloom Plum	'San Marzano'	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	x		80	n/a	Traditional Italian plum cooking tomato with superb flavor; dense fruit with few small seeds and easy-to-remove skin produce a great paste; also good for canning and drying; holds well on the vine and in storage. <u>Indeterminate.</u>

Blackberry	'Darrow'	<i>Rubus fruticosus</i>		x		5-6 feet	Large, luscious fruits with true gourmet blackberry flavor. Plants grow upright with little need for support. Long harvest period. Prune in April. Make sure plants get adequate water, but avoid saturating the soil. Requires excellent drainage. Fertilize only in the spring before flowering. Remove wild brambles, which can harbor diseases that can spread to your planting. Attracts wildlife.
Strawberry	'Honeoye'	<i>Fragaria</i> sp.		x		8-12"	Very large, firm, delicious fruit, conic with a bright red glossy color; June-bearing; self-pollinating; very vigorous growth - good runner producer making a nice matted row; consistent performer, highly rated, productive with a low incidence of fruit rot; good winter hardiness; best taste in light, well-drained soil; full sun; bred by Cornell University.
Strawberry	'Allstar'	<i>Fragaria x ananassa</i>		x		8-12"	Large, glossy, firm berries with an exceptionally sweet taste; light orange-red fruit; June-bearing; self-pollinating; good winter hardiness; disease-resistant to verticillium wilt, leaf scorch, powdery mildew, red stele, and tolerates botrytis rot.

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
