

Agricultural Literacy Week March 16 - 20, 2020




Agricultural Literacy Week unites communities and schools. Volunteers will share a special agriculturally themed story and lead an educational activity.

Theasants: A Conservation Management Trogram!

The Department of Environmental Conservation is again offering pheasant chicks to 4-Hers who are interested in raising a batch. The program offers an enjoyable challenge in responsible management. The pheasants are released on public land in the fall and offer a hunting opportunity for upland shooters. People in general also like to observe and hear the unusual call of the rooster during their vocal periods.

There are a number of resources available from the Extension office in reference to the pheasant program. They include, but are not limited to the project guidebook, Pheasant Rearing, and the video, "How to Raise Ring-necked Pheasants". We are also strongly encouraging cooperative ventures between 4-H/FFA youth and local sportsman clubs.

The Calf Scholarship Award Program is sponsored by the New York State Guernsey Breeders Association for the purpose of encouraging those who do not presently own Guernseys to become involved with the Guernsey Breed. A purebred Guernsey Calf will be awarded to the applicant who shows interest in the Guernsey breed and who has demonstrated the capabilities of developing the animal to its fullest potential. Applicant must be age 9-15 as of January 1st of application year. You do not have to belong to 4-H, FFA, or a breed club to participate. Award will be presented to the winner at the New York State Guernsey Breeders' Annual Meeting in April. All applications are due on March 1st this year. No late applications will be accepted. 


