

## 2020 Fair Checklist

### April

\_\_\_ 1<sup>st</sup> – Enrolled in 4-H

### May

\_\_\_ 15<sup>th</sup> – Turned in horse certificate to the 4-H office (please note the later than usual deadline)

\_\_\_ 15<sup>th</sup> – Obtained ownership of fair animals (excluding horse)

\_\_\_ Scheduled a time for the vet to come and do health paperwork (CVIs must be completed on or after May 1st of the current year and within 14 days of vet check-in at the fair)

### June

\_\_\_ 5<sup>th</sup> – TURNED IN ALL ADVANCED ENTRY PAPERWORK

- Animal and Educational Exhibit Advanced Entry Form
- Animal Health paperwork (health certificates (CVI), Coggins and Rabies)
- Animal Record Books
- Non-ownership forms
- Dairy Bar Sign-up
- Teen Leader and Jr. Superintendent Forms
- Project Certification Sheet
- Overnight Permission Form

\_\_\_ 22<sup>nd</sup> – ALL HEALTH FORMS MUST BE COMPLETED BY THIS DATE (paperwork will only be accepted after the 5<sup>th</sup>, without a late fee, if the age of the animal restricts vaccinations to be given at an earlier time or there is another excuse that has been approved by 4-H staff. Otherwise, any paperwork handed in after June 5<sup>th</sup> will have a late fee)

\_\_\_ TBA Attended fair clean up

### July

\_\_\_ 5<sup>th</sup> Fair Judging Day

\_\_\_ 7<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> – YATES COUNTY FAIR

\_\_\_ 12<sup>th</sup>- Release and pick-up of exhibits

\_\_\_ Isolated fair animals for two weeks after returning home from the fair

**Reminders:**

\_\_\_ You should already be working with your fair animal. The more time you put in now, the better your fair experience will be!!

\_\_\_ The 4-H office will keep copies of all your health paperwork. However, you need to keep the originals in a safe spot **AND** keep them with you at the fair.

\_\_\_ You will need to be present on Tuesday, July 7<sup>th</sup>, with your original health paperwork when the State Vet does animal inspections (about 10am). This will count towards Herdsmanship!
