## 4-H Afterschool Program

**Q: Can my child attend program on the days they are not scheduled to be in school?**

A: We are expecting your child on the days their cohort is scheduled to be attending school in person. If other accommodations are needed, please contact the program coordinator directly.

**Q: Will a snack be served every day still at program?**

A: Yes, your child will still receive a snack every day upon arrival of the program.

**Q: Will there be virtual programming on the days my child does not attend school?**

A: The 4-H team is working hard to create virtual programming to provide to the students of Jefferson County while they are not in school. Please be on the lookout for further information coming out for this.

**Q: Will my child be made to wear a mask while in program?**

A: The 4-H Afterschool Program will follow all school protocols for wearing a mask and social distancing. Your child will be required to wear a mask when they cannot maintain social distancing of 6 feet, and when they are in common areas such as the hallway.

**Q: What is your procedure if someone within the program tests positive for COVID-19?**

A: We will follow school procedures for positive COVID-19 cases. For current information regarding your district policy, please follow up with the school directly. At this time, students or staff that test positive will be isolated for a minimum of 10 days from start of symptoms. Student or staff must be 3 days without a fever and have a progressive improvement in symptoms before returning. Contacts to positive cases can return to school after a 14 day quarantine period.


**Q: What is the procedure for if someone in program develops a fever or other COVID-19 symptoms?**

A: Students will be isolated and monitored by the health safety monitor, and a parent will be notified that the child will need to be picked up immediately. From there, the program will follow school policy to determine when the child can return.

**Q: What is the new procedure for parent pick up?**

A: Each site has a Health Safety Monitor to assist in parent pick-up. We encourage all parents to remain outside of the school at all times. The Health Safety Monitor will meet each parent/guardian at their car, where the staff will check parent ID, sign the child out, then escort the child directly to the parents car. The Health Safety Monitor will be available at all times to meet parents by their car, so pickup times remain the same.
