




THREAD A NEEDLE


You can make many nice things by learning a few easy hand stitches. You don't always need a sewing machine to sew. You will need to start by learning to thread a needle.
















Hold the thread between the first finger and thumb of your right hand. Hold the end of the thread between the first finger and

thumb of the left hand.

STEP 5

Wrap the thread around the first finger of the left hand. Cross the end of the thread.






STEP 6

Tightly roll the thread between the first finger and thumb.


STEP 7

Roll the thread until the loop is pushed off the end of the first finger. To do this, push forward with the thumb.



STEP 8

Pull this loop into a knot with your thumb and middle finger. Pull the knot down to the end of the thread.



Just keep practicing until you can do it every time.
