What Is 4-H?

4-H is the largest youthserving organization in the country. It is a volunteer-led organization that reaches boys and girls through a variety of interactive programs. 4-H also provides programming for in-school and after-school settings.

What Types Of 4-H Memberships Are Available?

4-H Clubs are co-ed groups with at least five members, ages 5 - 18 years of age. **The Cloverbud Program** is open to youth 5 - 7 years of age.

Family 4-H is for 4-H members who do not belong to a club. They have an adult mentor and must complete at least one 4-H project and one community service each year.

What Does It Cost?

There are no state or national dues; however there is a \$15.00 yearly enrollment fee or \$35.00 per family with three members or more to participate in the Albany County 4-H Program. Some groups do collect dues or fees for activities or special events. Materials for projects are provided by members, their families, or their group.
