Choosing a Country. Try something new this year to choose your country. Here are a few ideas to try:

- 1. Grab a map and throw a dart
- 2. Spin a globe and stop it with your finger
- 3. Play pin the flag on the map
- 4. Put pics of the flags from around the world in a bowl and select randomly

If you have never been to our International Night, you are in for a treat! Here's how it works:

- Bring a dessert/finger food to share that reflects the culture of your country. Find out the history of that dessert - is it traditional to a religion or cultural group? Is it eaten for a special occasion? Is it a recent favorite food that found its way to new taste buds through cultural exchange?

- Set up a display about your country. You can use posters, flags, souvenir/items, etc. from the country. Another idea is to wear or bring traditional, historical, or popular style of clothing from your country. If you cannot find appropriate clothing, bring photos or types of fabric,

accessories, etc...be creative!

• **Perform a skit!** Be ready to share up on stage what you've learned about your nation's heritage with the other 4-H guests. You can do this with pictures, songs, skits...however you want to entertain and educate us! **Please only 3-5 minutes.**
