- **Project Records and Portfolios will be due into the office by Friday, September 12th.**

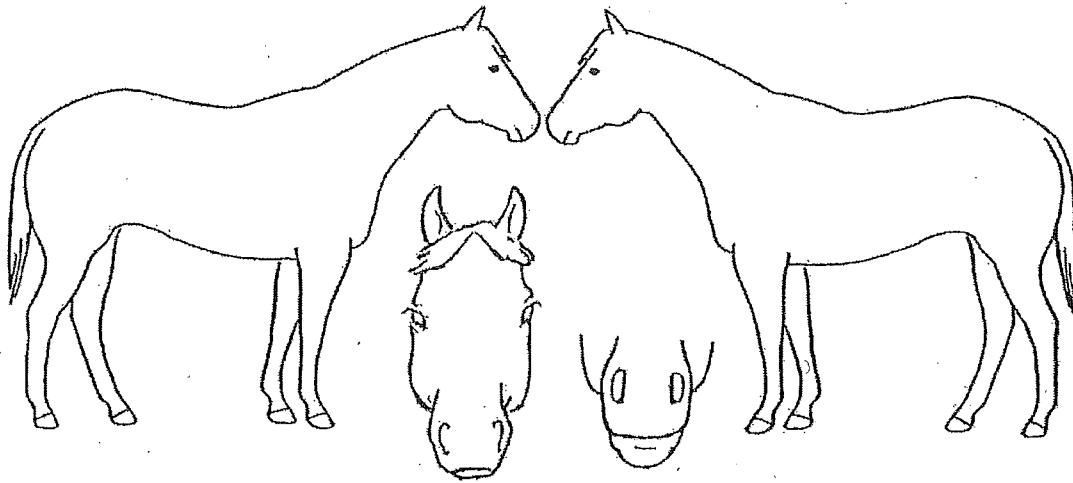
