

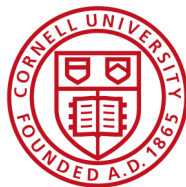
CORNELL COOPERATIVE EXTENSION OF WESTCHESTER COUNTY MASTER GARDENER VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

DIRECTIONS TO CATHERINE LUDDEN PROPERTY

Pre-registration required. See inside.
1 Crosshill Road, Hartsdale, NY 10530

From Route 287 (E or W), take Exit 4, Knollwood Road (Rte. NY100A). Head south approx. 1.8 mi. toward Hartsdale. Turn right at Ridge Road. Turn left in approx. 1.2 miles onto Topland Road. Turn right onto Crosshill Road. #1 is on the left.

From the Saw Mill Parkway (N or S) take Exit 17 (Dobbs Ferry/ Ardsley). Turn east onto Ashford Avenue at light (left from N and right from S). Proceed to light at Route 9A North, turn left. In approx. ½ mi. bear right onto Heatherdell Road. Proceed approx. 1 mi. to T at Sprain Road and turn right. Turn left at Rochambeau Drive. Left again onto Crosshill Road. #1 is on the right.

Please park on street.
