Qualifications:	Be 17 or 18 years old and reside in the City of Rochester; experience leading and managing fellow teens on community and school programs and projects.
Days and Hours:	8 weeks from Tuesday, July 5 through Thursday, August 25; 30 hours per week; Monday - Thursday from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
Compensation:	\$17.00 per hour stipend, paid weekly
