

Fair Check-List - 2023

April

___ 1st – Enrolled in 4-H

May

___ 1st - Turned in horse certificate to the 4-H office

___ 15th – Obtained ownership of fair animals (excluding horse)

___ Scheduled a time for the vet to come and do health paperwork (CVIs must be completed on or after May 1st of the current year and within 14 days of vet check-in at the fair)

June

___ 9th – TURNED IN ALL ADVANCED ENTRY FORMS (Fee applies for paperwork handed in late)

*Animal Health paperwork (health certificates (CVI), Coggins and Rabies)

*Animal Record Books

*Non-ownership forms

*Dairy Bar Sign-up

___ 26th – ALL HEALTH FORMS MUST BE COMPLETED BY THIS DATE (paperwork will only be accepted after the 9th, without a late fee, if the age of the animal restricts vaccinations to be given at an earlier time or there is another excuse that has been approved by 4-H staff.

___ Attended fair clean up (multiple dates are being planned)

July

___ 9th Exhibit Hall Judging Day

___ 10th – Fair Set-up Day

___ 11th-15th – YATES COUNTY FAIR

___ 16th- Release and pick-up of exhibits

___ Isolated fair animals for two weeks after returning home from the fair

Reminders:

___ You should already be working with your fair animal. The more time you put in now, the better your fair experience will be!!

___ The 4-H office will keep copies of all your health paperwork. However, you need to keep the originals in a safe spot **AND** keep them with you at the fair.

___ You will need to be present on Tuesday, July 11th, with your original health paperwork when the State Vet does animal inspections (about 10am). This will count towards Herdsmanship!
