April
1st – Enrolled in 4-H
May
1 st - Turned in horse certificate to the 4-H office
15 th – Obtained ownership of fair animals (excluding horse)
Scheduled a time for the vet to come and do health paperwork (CVIs must be completed on or after May 1st of the current year and within 14 days of vet check-in at the fair)
June
9th – TURNED IN ALL ADVANCED ENTRY FORMS (Fee applies for paperwork handed in late)
*Animal and Educational Exhibits Advanced Entry Form *Animal Health paperwork (health certificates (CVI), Coggins and Rabies) *Animal Record Books *Non-ownership forms *Dairy Bar Sign-up *Teen Leader and Jr. Superintendent Sign-up * Project Certification Sheets
26 th – ALL HEALTH FORMS MUST BE COMPLETED BY THIS DATE (paperwork will only be accepted after the 9 th , without a late fee, if the age of the animal restricts vaccinations to be given at an earlier time or there is another excuse that has been approved by 4-H staff.
Attended fair clean up (multiple dates are being planned)
July
9 th Exhibit Hall Judging Day
10 th – Fair Set-up Day
11th-15th – YATES COUNTY FAIR
16th- Release and pick-up of exhibits
Isolated fair animals for two weeks after returning home from the fair
Reminders:
You should already be working with your fair animal. The more time you put in now, the better your fair experience will be!!
The 4-H office will keep copies of all your health paperwork. However, you need to keep the originals in a safe spot AND keep them with you at the fair.
You will need to be present on Tuesday, July 11th, with your original health paperwork when the Stat Vet does animal inspections (about 10am). This will count towards Herdsmanship!
