### **Ulster County Community Health Improvement Plan**

- Vin Martello; Director of Community health Relations and Stacy Kraft; Public Health Education Coordinator, Ulster County Department of Health
- Stacy Kraft, Ulster County Department of Health
- Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP)
  - Try to align with NYS Dept of Health Prevention Agenda
  - Required to work with local hospitals to create a Community Health Assessment, then come up with a CHIP together

- Survey in collaboration with Sienna College, surveyed community members and non profit partners
- Community Health Assessment and Community Health Improvement Plan can be found on the Dept of Health website
- Information can be used by CBOs for program planning
- Part of the assessment is who is doing what in the county
- Prevention Agenda Leadership Team-21 community agency partners
- Action Plan centers around 3 areas
  - Prevent Chronic Disease-UC Dept of Health, and CCE Ulster County
  - Prevent Substance Abuse-TFAC
  - Promote healthy Women, Infants, and Children-Health Alliance, Institute for Family Health
- Short and long-term outcomes for each intervention
- The plan is not comprehensive, the strategies in the plan are high level and targeted, it does not include all the work being done around the county
- Collaborating and communicating with partners as they progress through deliverables to address barriers
- What do health disparities encompass? Situations where a particular demographic subgroup (age, gender, income, race, etc) experiences a significantly poorer health outcomes than the general population. Income is a huge driver of health disparities.

- City's Health & Wellness Department was created in 2018
- To facilitate policy, systems, and environmental changes in city
- City applied for Creating Healthy Schools and Communities grant in partnership with Family of Woodstock and CCEUC, grant is through May 2026
  - Policy-formal written statement
  - System-informal process
  - o Environment-changes to the physical environment
- Target audiences: community, schools, child care centers, communications
  - Buckets of work: food service guidelines, connecting routes to destinations, school nutrition and physical activity, early childcare
- Food service guidelines-supporting venues to create their own healthy food guidelines.
  Anywhere a food is served, distributed or sold.
  - Food and nutrition standards, Supportive strategies, Behavioral strategies-need all 3 to make impactful change
  - Best changes come from the community
  - Worked with People's Place to create signage, have a Nutrition & Food policy, purchased shelving

- Connecting routes to destinations-connecting destinations by various modes of active transportation
  - Pedestrian Bicycle Master Plan (Policy), various projects and redesigns of transportation spaces in the city (implementation)
- School nutrition and PA: Ninette Warner works with school officials and caregivers to improve food and PA policies in the schools
  - Ninette works in 3 elementary schools
  - Walk to School Day, healthier celebrations, training for school staff, other projects

- Early child care: Tracy Snyder at FOW does similar projects, specifically at early childcare centers
  - Tracy does an assessment of what they are already doing, works with them to improve their policies

- Communication: intentionally communication with community and people in power to convey information and support changes
- Gas stations/bodegas are not part of the program
- In schools and early childhood, do the educators also work with parents?
  - In K-12 try to do as much family recruitment as possible, but not doing direct education with caregivers
  - Early childhood: will be doing a parent-child cooking class, but mostly in the centers
