

Birding "Fact" for the Month


"Birds sing to attract mates, establish territories and maintain the bond between a male and female while they raise their young. But how does a bird actually learn its species' song? Does it hatch knowing it or must it hear the song first in order to learn it? The answer is not so simple, and no one rule applies to all species. Some birds begin calling even before they hatch, when they pierce the membrane inside the eggshell, giving them access to the air space within the egg. For these species, such as the northern cardinal, their songs and calls are entirely inherited. Young of other species learn their songs by listening to other birds. If these young birds routinely hear a song different from their parent species, some - such as the song sparrow - will still sing their own species' song. Others - such as the white-crowned sparrow - will sing whatever song they've heard. Regardless of how they developed their song, most birds learn their own species' song during the first year. Few birds, other than mimics like mockingbirds and brown thrashers, develop new songs or calls later in life.
