The 4-H program began in Dutchess County in 1913. Through 4-H young people learn positive behaviors and life skills such as persistence, communication, respect and commitment. 4-H youth *choose* to spend on average 200 hours of their free time each year dedicated to their projects, as well as participating in community service, public presentation events and leadership development. Projects range from raising, caring for and training animals to arts, crafts, literature and science.

Funding from sponsorship and cash donations accounted for approximately half of the income.















## Outcomes of the 2023 4-H A-Fair to Remember

Income \$42,516

Expenditure \$15,792

Net income raised \$26,724

Income was high for several reasons:

- Increased ticket sales in 2023
- Incredible support from the community in cash donations and sponsorship
- A \$5,000 matched donation from an anonymous source boosted giving
- A successful live and silent auction

Expenditure was low due to overwhelming in-kind donations:

- Millbrook Winery donated the use of the facitilites for free
- Superior Sanitation provided the toilet trailer as a sponsorship
- Adams Nursery donated all the flowers for tables
- Over 50 people and/or businesses donated items and good such as for the auction

These funds will be used in multiple ways to support existing 4-H'ers and expand the number and diversity of children supported by the 4-H program to learn and thrive. We will meet our goals and all remaining funds will be designated to help our youth throughout the program year.

If you were lucky enough to be at the A-fair, you will already know what for us was the biggest win. The community came together in a way that is truly inspiring. The kids shone as they worked together, played, learned and laughed together. From tiny tots to seniors, this really is a community to be proud of!
