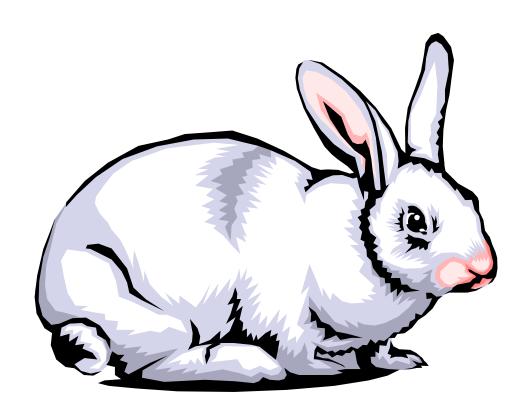
Dear 4-H'ers
